Elections for new board members will be held at the March 10th general meeting of the Lakewood Village Neighborhood Association. Nominations are made in February, so now is the time to think about getting involved. All positions will be up for election: President, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. The Secretary keeps a record of what happens at the board and general meetings every month, the Treasurer handles the money generated by advertising in *The Villager* and the paying of bills (for instance, printing of *The Villager* newsletter) and maintains the organization's checkbook. ## Neighborhood Enhancement Program Offers Paint and Upkeep Advice for Fairwood-side Residents

### **The Great Paint Giveaway**

How can you improve your house right now? If you live in the Neighborhood Enhancement Program area—150 Lakewood Village homes in the area bounded by Lawrence Expressway, Fairwood Avenue, and the Hetch Hetchy (John W. Christian) greenbelt—you can sign up for free house paint. You can do the painting yourself or hire a company to do it for you (make sure you can deduct the usual cost of the paint needed) to give your home a fresh look.. TW Painting's Tom Watkins told the residents who attended the third meeting of the Neighborhood Enhancement Program, January 8, that it takes 11 to 12 gallons for two coats on most Lakewood Village one-level houses, and about two gallons for the trim. A TW Painting job includes power washing, scraping, and priming, as well as painting and cleanup. Preparation takes two to three days, Watkins said, and the painting usually takes about two days. If you are interested in getting an estimate for a paint job from Tom Watkins (who will deduct the usual cost of paint if you get the free paint), see the TW Painting ad in this *Villager* issue for phone numbers.

To get the free paint (your choice of beige, off-white, or gray), contact Sunnyvale's neighborhood preservation specialist, Rich Gutierrez, (408) 730-7447 or e-mail [rgutierrez@ci.sunnyvale.ca.us](mailto:rgutierrez@ci.sunnyvale.ca.us). Rich has already distributed about 220 gallons of free paint.

### **Looking Good**

New paint is first on the list of ways to improve the way your house looks, according to Coldwell Banker Broker and Realtor Bobbie Lemberg, who has worked in Sunnyvale for 20 years. At the January 8 Neighborhood Enhancement Program meeting, she suggested touring your neighborhood to see which houses look good and why.

Although her emphasis was on preparing a house for sale, many of her suggestions—raking leaves, mulching flower beds, keeping potted plants watered, and painting the front door a bright color—are also good for residents who want to improve their houses and enhance the

neighborhood. Bobbie's handouts included detailed suggestions for house improvements and a list showing the return on remodeling projects when the house is sold; for example, a bathroom remodel that costs about \$12,000 adds about \$18,000 to the value of the house, a return of approximately 149%.

### **About Those Code Violations ...**

If you are in the Neighborhood Enhancement Program area and haven't cleaned up that accumulated stuff or construction debris in your front yard, if your front-yard shrubs are taller than 3 feet, if you park your car on the lawn, or if you have other code violations, you will get a letter from the city. If you don't respond to the letter, you will be visited by a city employee. If the problem isn't corrected, a warning letter goes to the property owner, and citations, including fines ranging from \$50 to \$500, follow. A Dumpster Day weekend, for Neighborhood Enhancement Program area residents only, in early March may help the residents of the 150 houses to avoid those expensive fines. These residents can dispose of almost everything except electronic equipment (TVs, computers, etc.) in a dumpster on their street on that day. Watch the *Villager* for further information on this event.

The Neighborhood Enhancement Program area is the focus right now, but everyone needs to be conscious of code violations and the possible fines if violations are not eliminated.

### **Fourth Meeting—Be There To Support the Program!**

The fourth Neighborhood Enhancement Program meeting for the Lakewood Village area bounded by Lawrence Expressway, Fairwood Avenue, and the Hetch Hetchy greenbelt is on February 12, 2004, in the Lakewood Park building, at 7:00 p.m. Good attendance is important if the program is to continue, and you'll almost certainly learn something new. ■

**Rodent, Wildlife, or Insect Problem?**

For those of you who did not attend the LVNA meeting of 14 Jan, you missed an excellent presentation and pamphlets from Kris Costa of the Santa Clara County Vector Control District. The VCD mission is to detect and minimize vector-borne diseases, to abate mosquitoes, and to assist the public in resolving problems with rodents, wildlife, and insects of medical significance. The VCD department acts as the informational source for community education in the prevention and control of insects, rodents and wildlife (such as mosquitoes, rats, mice, squirrels, raccoons, possums, and skunks). Their primary concern is the health and safety of the county residents and their pets.

The VCD's services include:

- Detection of the presence of vector borne disease through planned tests, surveys and samples.
- Inspection and treatment of known mosquito and rodent sources.
- Response to customer initiated service requests for identification, advisory, and/or control measures for mosquitoes, rodents, wildlife, and miscellaneous invertebrates (ticks, yellowjackets, cockroaches, bees, fleas, flies, etc.).

Ms. Costa's presentation focused on how the caretaking of the home and surroundings can help control and deter these transient critters in our community.

**Some recommendations**

- Keep your grounds free of excess food sources (fallen fruit, old vegetables, etc)
- Close-up or prevent entrance into areas (home and yard) that could be used to house rodents/wildlife.
- Clean up standing water to reduce mosquitoes nesting.

- Trapping and disposing of rodents/wildlife (as note above) is recommended. Trapping of rodents or wildlife and releasing them into the wild is prohibited. Careful with the wildlife trapping; contact VCD for further information.
- **Special care needs to be given when using any poison for pest control. Ensure that no child or pet could get access to these areas! Some chemicals can be used for killing or deterring rodents and wildlife (such as "Rodetrol" and "Getaway" spray) and are safe for your pets.**
- Pet entrance doors should be locked at night.
- Feed your pets only what they can eat at one feeding and avoid leaving pet food outside.
- Bird seed feeders should have a retainer on the bottom to catch any of the fallen food.

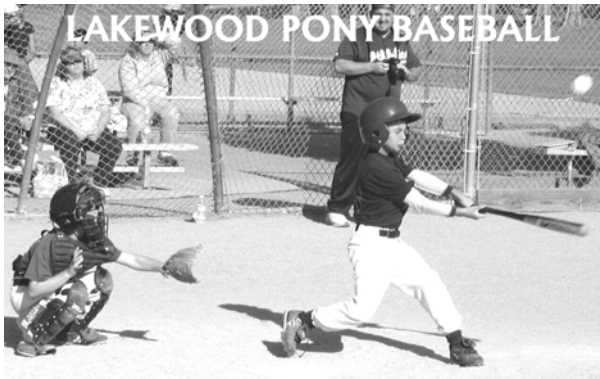

### Are You Raising a High-Self-Esteem Child?

Children who have high self-esteem are confident, can-do kids. They're nice to other kids and aren't afraid to talk to adults or ask questions. They're willing to try new things and don't get overly discouraged if they fail. High-self esteem children do better in school and better in life. Here's a simple check list developed by Bettie B. Youngs, Ph.D., author of "The 6 Vital Ingredients of Self-Esteem and How to Develop Them in Your Child":

1. Does your child feel physically safe at school and at home?
2. Does your child hide his emotions because he's afraid he'll be put down or beaten up emotionally with sarcasm or hurtful words?
3. Does your child regularly praise or complement her siblings and other children or is she always making fun of others, especially around her friends?
4. Does your child feel accepted, liked and appreciated at school and at home or does he tell you that everyone's always picking on him and no one likes him?
5. Is your child willing to try new things like a new sport or an after-school activity? If she isn't very good at it, does she give up and want to quit right away?
6. Does your child laugh easily and think that life is good and everything will work out in the end, even if things aren't going well at the moment?

As parents, we want to build positive self-esteem in our children so that they can see themselves as the winners we know them to be. One simple way to help your child to develop a positive self-image is by really listening to their concerns without trying to solve the problem for them. Sometimes, all kids (and adults) need is to know that there's someone they can talk to who will love them no matter what. ■

## This Month in Lakewood History...

**50 years ago:** In 1954, the City of Sunnyvale launched a plan to annex 129 acres from the County, including the Santa Clara Valley Airport area, at the northeast corner of Lawrence Station Road and Bayshore Highway (now Units II and IV).



**49 years ago:** In 1955, Sunnyvale filed the papers to annex the property according to their 1954 plan, except that they annexed 150 acres.

**46 years ago:** In 1958, the LVRA Social Committee was formed. This "women's auxiliary" of the LVRA held bake sales and organized social events. How times have changed!

**42 years ago:** In 1962, Bayside School (Lakewood's 3<sup>rd</sup> elementary school) was opened.

**10 years ago:** In 1994, Lakewood Village residents appeared in front of the Sunnyvale City Council to voice concerns about increased traffic that might result from the planned development of the Mercado commercial area. Ten years later, we're still at it!

## Sunnyvale to Provide Free Gun Locks

As part of its continuing effort to enhance public safety, the City of Sunnyvale will provide 1,300 free firearm safety kits to residents. This is just one of many programs that have earned the City its award-winning record for promoting a safe community.

The Sunnyvale Department of Public Safety (DPS), through a partnership with Project ChildSafe, a nationwide firearms safety education program, will distribute the safety kits, which include a gun lock. The kits will be available at DPS headquarters and at various community events.

Sunnyvale residents are encouraged to pick up a Project ChildSafe safety kit so they can securely store their firearms. Each kit contains a safety brochure and a cable-style gun lock. The locks fit on most types of handguns, rifles and shotguns. The goal is to prevent a child or any other unauthorized person from accessing a firearm in the home.

The City of Sunnyvale was named the fifth-safest city of its size in the nation by Morgan Quitno Press in 2003, continuing a trend of top-five finishes in that annual survey.
