Two Tons More Than Last Year!

Dumpster Day went smoothly for the most part, although one dumpster did tip over while being picked up. No one was hurt, but it was exciting!

The enthusiasm and dedication of the volunteers are what make this event such a success.

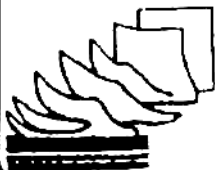

July 14 General Meeting

Sunnyvale Mayor Dean Chu, City Council member Melinda Hamilton, and Planning Commission Chair Chris Moylan described the status of the city's operations and development projects. An open forum session on city and Lakewood Village issues followed.

Dumpster Day Monitor packages were distributed. A discussion about the Dumpster Day (Saturday, July 16) process led to agreement that dumping on the dumpster delivery day (Friday) would be at the discretion of each dumpster monitor.

July 28 Board Meeting

Dumpster Day summary – 58 dumpsters full, 173 tons, 125 tires, and \$431.00 collected for items at the Dumpster Day Sale.

Other items: The Treasurer provided a financial report. Calendar of events and guest speaker recommendations were discussed. Preliminary plans were made for the LVNA Picnic; the tentative date is Saturday, September 17.

The Bank of Santa Clara, where the LVNA checking account is, will begin charging \$10 per month as of December 1 for accounts with less than a \$3000 daily balance. Board members will contact other banks to see if we can find one that meets LVNA needs without a service charge. ■

Lakewood Village's 50th

Part 4: The Neighborhood Gets Organized

This is the fourth in a series of articles celebrating the 50 year history of Lakewood Village. The first three appeared in the February, March, and May issues.

The LVRA

The predecessor to today's Lakewood Village Neighborhood Association (LVNA) was the Lakewood Village Residents Association (LVRA). The LVRA was formed in January of 1958. It was primarily funded by annual dues of \$2.00-\$2.50 per household. Membership was not a requirement for residents in Lakewood Village, and nonmembers were not excluded from the benefits of LVRA activities, but residents were encouraged to show their support for the LVRA by becoming members, attending meetings, and participating in activities of one kind or another. Other funding came from bake sales and rummage sales and from donations of cash or merchandise from local merchants.

The LVRA was extraordinarily active and effective in a variety of community affairs. In February of 1958, a

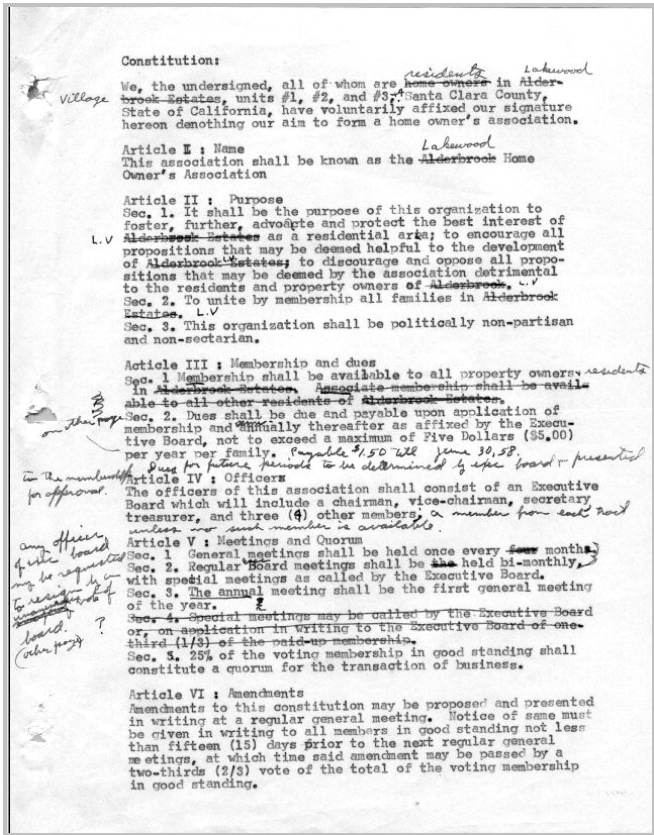
social committee was also formed. In April, the first issue of the *Villager* was published. The first picnic was held in July, but because there were no parks built in Lakewood Village at that time, the picnic was held at Blackberry Farms (in what is now Cupertino). A "Teenage LVRA" was formed in October, and in December, a Christmas party was held at a local club. In June of 1959, the LVRA was incorporated as a non-profit organization. The first Holiday Lighting Contest and Holiday Parade were held that December.

Some of the LVRA's activities, like the annual picnic, lighting contest, parade, and publication of the *Villager*, continue to this day. Other activities were shorter lived. An Easter egg hunt was held at Lakewood Park in 1965, and by 1971 it was augmented by an Easter parade. The first of several Western Days events was held in 1965 in the parking lot of Dick's Plaza (now Lakewood Village Shopping Center). In 1967, the first (and only) Miss Lakewood Village beauty pageant was held. In 1970, there was a Halloween "Spook House."

The LVRA was credited with many accomplishments, especially during its first five years of operation. Among those accomplishments were:

- o Neighborhood participation in a hierarchy consisting of elected LVRA officers, volunteer leaders for each of the four neighborhood units, and volunteer leaders for each block.

- Publication of a monthly newsletter, the *Villager*
- Successful lobbying of the City of Sunnyvale for construction of a new fire station near Lakewood Village.
- Working with the city on neighborhood issues, including street lights, street cleaning, traffic control, and insect and weed abatement.
- Working with the Lakewood Village Merchant Association on shopping center issues.
- Lobbying the city and county governments on issues regarding nearby zoning and development proposals, most notably defeating a proposal to build a slaughterhouse near Lakewood Village.



FIRE STATION FOR LAKEWOOD VILLAGE

AT THE APRIL 10TH BERRYVALE CITY COUNCIL MEETING A VERY IMPORTANT DECISION WAS APPROVED FOR LAKEWOOD VILLAGE. THE LV.R.A. WAS MEMBERED FOR OUR INTEREST IN CIVIL AFFAIRS ID IN SHOWING A DEFINITE NEED FOR FIRE STATIONS NOT ONLY IN LAKEWOOD VILLAGE BUT NEARBY BERRYVALE. BY THIS DECISION IT WAS DECIDED THAT STATIONS #4 (WOLFF RD. AND QUINN) #5 (NEAR LOCKWOOD) AND #6 (LAKEWOOD VILLAGE AREA) WOULD BE CONSTRUCTED AND COMPLETED BY THE CALLENDAR YEAR 1965. WE HOPED THAT STATION #5 WOULD BE BUILT FIRST BUT AS IT IS, THE DECISION OF THE COUNCIL WAS SUCH THAT NO ONE STATION WOULD BE STARTED FIRST BUT THAT THEY ALL WOULD BE CONSTRUCTION AT THE SAME TIME.

I PERSONALLY FEEL THAT THE DECISION WAS GOOD ENOUGH, AS WE DID ACCOMPLISH THE MAJOR PORTION OF OUR TASK.

THE STATION FOR LAKEWOOD VILLAGE WILL BE LOCATED AT LAWRENCE EXPRESS-WAY AND ELKO RD. FOR THOSE WHO ARE NOT FAMILIAR WITH THIS LOCATION IT IS THE SIDE STREET INTO THE INDUSTRIAL AREA BEFORE YOU REACH MT. VIEW ALVISO RD. IT WILL BE ON THE CORNER. ANOTHER THING WE WERE TOLD, THESE STATIONS ARE BEING PAID FOR BY BONDS WHICH WERE PASSED IN 1961, THIS MEANS NO TAX INCREASE.



Sunnyvale. At its peak, the LVRA had four officers, eight unit directors, four social committee officers, and dozens of block captains. About ten people regularly composed the editorial staff of the *Villager*, and local scout troops delivered the newsletter. Despite many years of neighborhood participation and accomplishment, the LVRA eventually ceased operation sometime in the mid-1970s.

The LVNA

The LVNA was formed in October of 1991, by Judy Fernandez and Vicky Piazza. The reasons for re-forming a neighborhood association were:

- To educate and create awareness;
- To give opportunities to get acquainted with each other;
- To allow the community to come together.

The LVNA has continued many of the traditions established by the LVRA, including monthly meetings, publication of the *Villager*, and events like the picnic, the lighting contest, and the holiday parade.

The LVNA also acts as a liaison between Lakewood Village residents and the City of Sunnyvale, and vice versa. The LVNA's working relationship with the city has been beneficial for Lakewood Village. Among its results are renovation of Fairwood Park and landscaping of the Hetch-Hetchy right-of-way as a neighborhood greenbelt (the John W. Christian Greenbelt, named after a former director of Sunnyvale's Parks and Recreation Department who was instrumental in developing the bare-ground easement into a landscaped community resource).

Unlike the LVRA, the LVNA does not ask residents to pay annual dues. All residents are automatically members, and funding for LVNA activities is derived primarily from *Villager* advertising revenue. The LVNA had "unit managers" in the 1990s, similar to the LVRA's "unit directors," but today's LVNA has no such hierarchy. Also, the LVNA does not have a social committee; the LVRA Social Committee was essentially a women's auxiliary organization, but women are now equal partners in the LVNA. The current LVNA operates with only five officers and a handful of regular volunteers.

Participating in the LVNA can lead to positions in city government; several past LVNA officers have gone on to larger civic roles in Sunnyvale. For example, former LVNA president Fred Fowler was elected to the City Council and then became mayor of the City of Sunnyvale, former president Vicki Piazza went on to become the chairperson of the Sunnyvale Planning Commission, and former president Jessica Lee became president of the Fremont Union High School District. Community activism has been a hallmark of LVNA participants. ■
