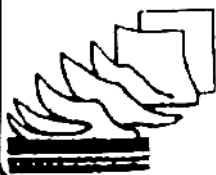

**October in Your Yard and Garden**

- Purchase spring bulbs for the best selection.
- Shop for native plants and set them in the garden.
- Purchase fall foliage plants in the nursery; the fall color of seed-grown plants varies greatly even in the same variety.
- Continue to weed. Add young, seedhead-free weeds and excess summer growth to the compost pile. Remember to keep the pile as damp as a wrung-out sponge for faster composting.
- Keep after the snails.
- Use a strong spray from the hose to wash away aphids.
- Water plants as needed.
- Stabilize plants that might be harmed by autumn wind.
- Water roses but withhold all fertilizer. When the ground freezes in colder areas, mulch the rose bed heavily.
- Continue to pinch off dead flowers. When frost comes to the garden, move fuchsias and begonias grown in pots to a sheltered, warmer location.
- Finish transplanting fall- and winter-flowering plants into the bedding plot. Soak all newly transplanted plants until the rains come.

•Harvest vegetables as they ripen. Plant the vegetable garden with cool-season crops such as beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, onions, parsnips, and turnips. If you put your vegetable garden to rest over the winter, cover it with manure so that the manure can decompose and age over the winter.

- Flush your watering system to remove mineral deposits.
- Rake up leaves. Continue to pull up dying annuals and vegetables. Add garden debris, except seed-bearing weeds and diseased plants, to the compost pile.
- Pick up fallen branches, pots, or other debris from the garden to reduce the number of over-wintering sites for snails, slugs, insects, and fungal spores. Continue to go through the garden and examine plants for black spots, bright orange rust pustules, white powdery mildew, rotted stems or branches, large, irregularly shaped galls near the soil, or other signs of infection. Pull up the infected plants and rake up infected leaves and dispose of them. Do not put infected material into the compost bin. Bring a trash can with you into the garden so you can immediately dispose of infected material without spreading disease by dragging it through the garden.
- After cleaning up the garden, rinse gardening tools with a solution of one part bleach to three parts water. Then coat your tools lightly with oil to keep them from rusting.

## Complaints Bring Responses

Several Lakewood Village residents have complained about the motor home parked in the shopping center and the activities of people behind the Valero gas station and around the entrance to the greenbelt path. LVNA board members contacted the Sunnyvale Department of Public Safety about these matters. The following were received from the Lakewood Village Neighborhood Preservation representative and the Department of Public Safety.

Neighborhood Preservation staff worked with Public Safety regarding concerns about a motor home parked at the Lakewood Village shopping center used for human habitation. Public Safety informed Neighborhood Preservation that they spoke with the occupants of the motor home and was informed that they are living in the motor home because they are "keeping an eye on the property" for Mr. Yee, the property owner.

Staff checked with Planning regarding a section in the Sunnyvale Municipal Code that states, "The occupying of a motor home is permitted in a non-residential zone when it is demonstrated for security purposes." Planning advised staff that human habitation of a motor home is allowed in a situation like this; however, a miscellaneous plan permit is required and conditions must be adhered to by the property owner and occupants of the motor home.

Based on this information, staff contacted Mr. Yee and advised him that a permit is required through the Planning Division to have people living in a motor home on his property. Mr. Yee said that he was not aware of the permit requirements and was doing the owners of the motor home a favor by allowing them to

stay on his property in return for them keeping an eye on the property at night. Mr. Yee informed staff that he did not want to apply for a permit and that he would contact the owners of the motor home and give them written notice that they are no longer allowed to stay in the motor home on his property overnight. Parking the motor home during the daytime does not constitute a violation.

Staff is waiting for a copy of the notice sent to the motor-home occupants from Mr. Yee stating that the occupants of the motor home are no longer allowed to reside on the property of the Lakewood Village shopping center. A copy of the notice will be forwarded to Public Safety so they can monitor the situation during the evening hours.

Public Safety staff responded that the concerns have been passed on to one of the swing-shift lieutenants, who is responsible for the Lakewood Village beats. His officers have contacted the RV's occupants and discussed concerns with them. He has also asked his officers to give special attention to the transients who are causing the problems at the shopping center behind the gas station. Public Safety says that the officers will give these concerns their immediate and serious attention and strictly enforce the laws at their lieutenant's direction. The lieutenant will also work closely with neighborhood preservation about these issues.

Public Safety added "Thank you for bringing these issues to our attention. Without this type of assistance we have no way of knowing about many of these types of problems and it greatly assists us." ■



## Get Rid of Hazardous Waste Safely

Lakewood Village and other Sunnyvale residents can safely dispose of unwanted hazardous items on the third Saturday of each month. Saturday, October 15 is the next hazwaste dropoff date at the SMaRT station.

A wide variety of household materials are not safe for disposal in the main trash stream and require special handling and disposal. Paints, stains, insecticides, flammable or combustible liquids, pool chemicals, compressed gas barbecue tanks, and even fire extinguishers fall under the general heading of hazardous waste.

Hazardous materials can be dropped between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. on October 15 at 164 Carl Road, near the SMaRT station, just north of the intersection of Borregas Avenue and Caribbean Drive.

There are some restrictions on materials to be dropped off. There is a limit of five gallons or 50 pounds of material per vehicle; materials should be carried in their original, non-leaking containers and should be in boxes or bags you do not want, as no containers will be returned.

***Einstein's Ideas To Be Featured at the Sunnyvale Public Library***

In celebration of the 100th anniversary of Albert Einstein's special theory of relativity, the Sunnyvale Public Library has been named one of 20 libraries nationwide to serve as an outreach site for the NOVA television special, *Einstein's Big Idea* (Tuesday, October 11 on PBS television). The special is based on David Bodanis's book *E=mc<sup>2</sup>: A Biography of the World's Most Famous Equation*.

**Gravity Probe B: Testing Einstein's Universe**, Saturday, October 15, 2 p.m. NASA's Shannon Range will give an interactive presentation on this sophisticated experiment designed to test Einstein's general theory of relativity. The world's most precise gyroscopes are measuring whether time and space are warped by Earth's presence, and if the Earth's rotation drags space-time around with it. *For students 6<sup>th</sup> grade and up and adults.*

**Einstein Big and Small**, with comedian and physicist Norm Goldblatt, Tuesday, October 18, 7 p.m. A popular lecture exploring the very large and the very small. Scientists and nonscientists alike deal with numbers much smaller and much larger than can be comprehended directly. Norm Goldblatt will acquaint you with both these worlds, microscopic and cosmic, to bring an increasing awareness of the power of the human intellect and of the success we have had in extending the range of our normal senses to the far regions of the physical universe.

**Book Discussion: A Short History of Nearly Everything** by Bill Bryson, Thursday, October 20, 7 p.m. Bryson's book is a highly readable account of scientific knowledge. From atoms to Earth to the universe, and the rise of civilizations, Bryson describes the seminal discoveries in nearly every branch of the sciences. ■

**Halloween Safety Tips**

- Make sure your yard is clear of such things as ladders, hoses, dog leashes, and flower pots that can trip the young ones.
- Pets get frightened on Halloween. Confine them to protect them from cars or inadvertently biting a trick-or-treater.
- Battery-powered jack o'lantern candles are preferable to a real flame.
- If you do use candles, place the pumpkin well away from where trick-or-treaters will walk or stand.
- Make sure paper or cloth yard decorations won't be blown into a flaming candle.

**Parents:**

- Make your child eat dinner before setting out.
- Children should carry quarters (or a cell phone) so they can call home.
- Ideally, young children of any age should be accompanied by an adult.
- If you buy a costume, look for one made of flame-retardant material.
- Older children should know where to reach you and when to be home.
- You should know where they're going.
- Although tampering is rare, tell children to bring the candy home to be inspected before consuming anything.
- Look at the wrapping carefully and toss out anything that looks suspect.
