Lakewood School Principal to Speak at General Meeting

At the February 8, 2007 LVNA general meeting, Mrs. Annette Grasty, principal of Lakewood School, will speak to us about the recent break-in problems at the school and the plan for a school-surrounding fence to try to stop the crime. What will the new fence mean for the neighborhood? What about after-school and summer use of the school grounds? Will such a fence send a negative message about our neighborhood? What other options might there be? Our new Neighborhood Resource Officer, Jim Davis will also be at the February 8 meeting to discuss this and other neighborhood public safety issues.

Downtown Redevelopment Outreach Meetings

On January 20, 2007, I attended an informational session about the plans for the downtown Sunnyvale redevelopment as proposed by the likely new developer. Sunnyvale City Council planned to make a final decision about this developer in late January. This is a HUGE project, involving a new grocery store, office

space, residences, retail space, a movie theater, and perhaps even a new hotel. It will change the entire face of the downtown, most notably by restoring the original street grid. The projected completion time for most of the retail space is the first quarter of 2009. There will be other opportunities for people to offer input and learn about the redevelopment as it goes ahead. I have been interested in this project because I would like to see the developer incorporate as many "green" building practices as possible, particularly making use of alternative energy possibilities such as solar. Other opportunities for input concern issues such as having community meeting space, and safe places for teens to congregate. limits. I have enjoyed being president, but I think that even if I could continue on it would be better to have someone new. *If you are interested in this position, or any of the other board positions, please contact any of the current board members and ask questions.*

Elections for new board members will be held at the March 8 general meeting of the Lakewood Village Neighborhood Association. Nominations can be made right up until we vote on March 8, but now is the time to think about getting involved. All positions will be up for election: President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice

President, Secretary, and Treasurer. The Secretary keeps a record of what happens at the monthly board and general meetings; the Treasurer handles the money generated by advertising in the *Villager*, pays the bills (for instance, for printing of the newsletter), and maintains the LVNA checkbook. The President is listed as a first point of contact between the Neighborhood Association and the City of Sunnyvale and writes a monthly column for the *Villager*. The 1st and 2nd Vice Presidents serve as backup for the President.

The board members are simply people who are willing to spend some time on a regular basis being involved in our neighborhood association. They keep in contact primarily through e-mail, attend the general meetings, and help organize various activities throughout the year, such as the picnic, the Holiday Parade, and Dumpster Day. Other ways to get involved include meetings with Sunnyvale city officials over issues such as park usage and traffic problems and quarterly meetings with other neighborhood association officers in Sunnyvale. New ideas are welcome. The LVNA is an active organization with a long history. To continue, it needs people willing to put in some effort. *Get involved. Get on the Board!*

February in Your Yard and Garden

- ☼Purchase bare-root plants. Cover the roots until you have the time and the weather is right for planting.
- ☼Order bare-root fruit trees from specialty nurseries. They will usually stop shipping bare-root fruit trees by the end of March.
- ☼Send in orders to seed companies before they run out of stock later in spring.
- ☼Clean and repair garden tools. Sharpen the blades of pruning tools and shovels. Service the lawn mower.
- ☼Complete pruning of deciduous trees, shrubs, vines, fruit trees, and roses.
- ☼If desired and if deciduous plants have not leafed out yet, apply a last application of dormant spray to kill overwintering insects. It is particularly important to use a lime sulfur spray for peach and nectarine trees to prevent a fungus commonly known as peach leaf curl that causes distorted leaves and scarred fruit.
- ☼Select and plant azaleas, camellias, and rhododendrons while they are in bloom.
- ☼Fertilize spring-blooming bulbs as the foliage emerges. Some growers recommend dried blood meal; follow the directions on the package, sprinkling the blood meal around the emerging foliage.

Here's a cold one for you, Pop! ■





The City of Sunnyvale has announced the opening of the nomination period for its fourth annual Awards for Excellence in Early Education. The program recognizes high-quality early-educators in the Sunnyvale community, and highlights the crucial role early child care providers play in a child's social, physical, emotional, and intellectual well-being.

Nominations are being sought from parents and others who have first-hand experience with the nominee's commitment to providing high-quality early-learning experiences for young children. Awards are given in recognition of six categories of service, including:

Infant Child Care Center; Preschool/Child Care Center (preschool-age); School-age Child Care Center; Family Child Care Provider; Child Care Center or Preschool Director; and Child Care or Preschool Teacher.

Each nominee will be evaluated on the basis of criteria from the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). Sunnyvale's Child Care Advisory Board will make the final selections.

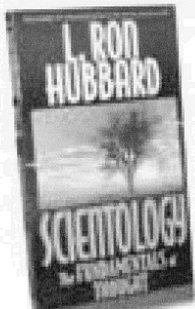
