President's Column

Register for Kindergarten

Kindergarten registration for both Village schools is from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday. A registration packet can be picked up in the office of Fairwood or Lakewood school. Incoming kindergarteners must be 5 years old before December 2. The parent must present: three proofs of residence (current picture ID—California driver license or ID, a current mortgage statement or lease agreement, and another ID—current-month PG&E bill, bank statement, or car registration, etc. (no phone bills are accepted); immunization records; and verification of birth, to register your child for kindergarten. ■

April in Your Yard and Garden

When the garden soil is dry enough to work in without the soil clinging to the shovel, dig in lavish quantities of compost or other organic amendments. This is particularly important in the vegetable garden.

☀ Before digging into the spring gardening season, clean and repair garden tools; sharpen the blades of pruning tools and shovels; service the lawn mower.

☀ When spring-blooming bulbs fade, leave the dying foliage intact to draw nutrients down into the bulb for next year's bloom. To cover the fading bulb foliage, set out six-packs of lobelia and sweet alyssum.

☀ Begin weeding while the weeds are young and the ground is still wet.

☀ In preparation for the coming hot, dry season, apply a mulch.

☀ Take cuttings for new plants from azaleas, carnations, chrysanthemums, geraniums, and succulents.

☀ Fertilize roses and crape myrtles. Fertilize azaleas, camellias, and rhododendron when they finish blooming. If you did not fertilize them last month, fertilize citrus, flowering plants about to bloom, trees, shrubs, and cool-season lawns.

☀ Prune spring-blooming plants as they finish blooming. Prune hydrangeas, fuchsias, and bougainvilleas.

☀ Plant out summer bulbs. Set out summer-flowering plants.

☀ Watch out for snails and earwigs, both of which devour seedlings. Use a strong spray from the hose to wash away aphids. Wrap fruit tree trunks with a sticky

tape to control ants. Wrap low so that birds, particularly hummingbirds, will not be attracted.

Get Rid Of Your Unwanted Vehicle-Free

Sunnyvale residents who have a vehicle taking up parking space may have the vehicle disposed of at no cost during Sunnyvale's Spring Clean-up Tow-away program.

Through April 30, residents may call the Sunnyvale Department of Public Safety (DPS) and request a pick-up appointment. Towing will take place in May. Requests will be sent to a city-approved towing company, which will call residents directly to arrange for pick-up of the vehicle. Vehicle owners must sign over ownership and turn in the vehicle's pink slip to the approved towing company. Vehicles must be towable, with four inflated tires, and have all debris and garbage removed.

Vehicles removed during the spring clean-up do not qualify as an IRS tax donation. For additional information on the program and to schedule your vehicle pick-up, contact Michelle Tani in DPS at (408) 730-7104, TDD (408) 730-7501. ■

Exchange Your Mercury Fever Thermometer

Mercury is a toxic substance, yet many of us still have mercury-based thermometers in our medicine cabinets. On Friday, April 20, the City of Sunnyvale will hold a fever thermometer exchange at the Sunnyvale Community Center, 550 E. Remington Drive, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., and again from 4 to 6 p.m. To avoid breakage and contamination, the thermometer must be in a closed, unbreakable container, such as the original case or a soda or water bottle with screw-on cap. That container must be put in a sealable plastic bag. Just place debris neatly out at the curb the evening before or by 6:00 a.m. on the morning of your regularly scheduled collection day. Do not put any of your curbside material on top of water meter boxes, and do not include hazardous waste (paint, thinners, pesticides, etc.).

Note: Drivers will start collection at 6:00 a.m. during Extra Garbage Pick-Up instead of the usual 7:00 a.m. Larger items will be picked up by a separate truck on your regularly scheduled pick-up day. ■

Earth Day Events Include Citywide Garage Sale

Earth Day, Sunday, April 22, will be celebrated through an array of community events in Sunnyvale this year. During the week of April 16–22, the city is promoting a variety of ongoing and new Earth-friendly events throughout the community, including the annual Sunnyvale Citywide Garage Sale on Saturday, April 21. This 15-year-old program is designed to encourage circulation and reuse of household goods rather than wasting or discarding them in landfills.

Other Earth Day events include: a bird-watching tour, Wednesday, April 18, noon–1 p.m., at 1444 Borregas Avenue (near the closed landfill at Borregas and Carl Road); a green kitchens workshop, Wednesday, April 18, 7–8 p.m. at the Sunnyvale Public Library, 665 W. Olive Avenue; and a compost workshop, April 21, 10 a.m.–noon at the Sunnyvale Community Center, 550 E. Remington Drive.

The City of Sunnyvale is also joining a county-wide campaign to promote the reuse of grocery shopping bags. The city's Earth Day programs are free of charge.
