June in Your Yard and Garden

- ☀ Weed. Do not let the weeds form seedheads. Be sure to knock down tall dry grasses because they create a serious fire hazard.
- ☀ Add young, seedhead-free weeds to the compost pile. Remember to keep the pile as damp as a wrung-out sponge for faster composting. Turn the pile occasionally.
- ☀ Watch out for snails and earwigs, both of which devour seedlings.
- ☀ Use a strong spray from the hose to wash away aphids.
- ☀ Wrap fruit tree trunks with a sticky tape to control ants. Wrap low so that birds, particularly hummingbirds, will not be attracted. Fruit will be ripening soon and the ants will go after the fruit. Water plants as needed.
- ☀ Insulate the garden soil from hot, dry weather by applying a two-inch-thick mulch.
- ☀ Fertilize plants if you see signs of pale, lackluster growth. Yellow leaves with green veins often indicate an iron deficiency, which can be corrected with chelated iron.
- ☀ Fertilize the lawn. Fertilize all flowering plants about to bloom. Fertilize roses.
- ☀ Pinch off dead flowers, particularly off lilacs and other late-spring flowering shrubs. Make sure you get the entire flower head when dead-heading annuals—including the swollen ovaries where seeds form. This will encourage new flowers as the plant rushes to reproduce itself.
- ☀ Transplant summer-flowering plants into the bedding plot. Hot weather is hard on newly transplanted plants. Shade them for a few days with

the temporary shelter of an umbrella or wooden shake. Stake tall sprawling flowers such as delphiniums and dahlias.

- ☀ Continue to plant the vegetable garden. Thin vegetable seedlings that were sown too close together by snipping them with scissors. Harvest vegetables as they ripen, picking them early in the day.
- ☀ Be very attentive to your watering system to make sure that it is in good working order. Soak all newly transplanted plants deeply.

And Don't Plant These

Hottentot fig (iceplant with yellow flowers),
Vinca major (periwinkle),
 licorice plant,
 scarlet wisteria,
 broom,
 pampasgrass,
 cotoneaster.

California Invasive Plant Council information notes that these plants are among those that have escaped from gardens and are displacing native species and changing natural processes in the San Francisco Bay area. The Web site www.cal-ipc.org offers alternatives to the plants listed above and gives details about the problems these "pest plants" create when they go wild. Some Lakewood Village residents know, for example, that rats favor ivy growth. ■

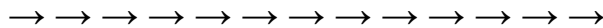
Dumpster Day Is Saturday, June 30, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Dumpster Day Rules

YES!:

- Dumping on Saturday June 30, 2007.
- Trash
- Furniture
- Wood
- Fence wood
- Appliances (except refrigerators or air conditioning units)
- Car parts and car body pieces without ANY fluids
- Small amounts of concrete (no entire driveways!)
- Small amounts of construction debris (no commercial dumping!)
- Tires (ONLY in the tire dumpster, which will be located between the two gas stations at the Lakewood Village Shopping Center).
- Dried paint

Help Lakewood Village keep Dumpster Day by respecting the volunteer dumpster monitors and the dumping rules!



Take items in the No list at right to the SMaRT Station, 164 Carl Road on June 16, July 21, or any other third Saturday of the month, between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m.. To get to the SMaRT Station, go north on Lawrence Expressway (becomes Caribbean Drive) to Borregas Avenue and turn right. Follow the signs for the Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off Event. Take the hazwaste in a sealed container that doesn't leak or bags or buckets that you don't want to keep. Take no more than 5 gallons or 50 pounds per trip to the station.

NO, NO, NO:

- Dumping before Saturday June 30, 2007.
- Computer monitors (see *No Hazwaste* on page 1)
- Television sets (see *No Hazwaste* on page 1)
- Refrigerators
- Air conditioning units
- Car parts with fluids
- Big loads of concrete
- Commercial construction debris
- Motor oil
- Adhesives
- Pool chemicals
- Oil filters
- Insecticides
- Aerosol cans
- Antifreeze
- Herbicides
- Automotive fluids
- Mercury (thermometers)
- Batteries
- Fire extinguishers
- Household & automotive cleaners
- Latex and oil-based paints and stains (paint that has been poured onto newspaper and dried is okay to dump)
- Flammable or combustible liquids
- Compressed gas cylinders
- Syringes (syringes may be placed in an approved sharps container or 2 liter bottle with cap so the contents are visible).
