CFL Bulbs Will Save Money for LV Residents

Compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs) from Pacific Gas & Electric (PG&E) went to many Lakewood Village residents on October 27, 2007. The 32 volunteers who delivered the free bulbs weren't able to cover the whole neighborhood, but 277 bulbs were distributed. The volunteers included 11 *Villager* walkers.

According to PG&E, a compact fluorescent bulb will last ten times as long as an incandescent bulb and uses significantly less energy, so one bulb will save you \$47 over its lifetime. The volunteer distributors just saved the Lakewood Village residents who took the free bulbs more than \$13,000! Every year those 277 bulbs are used instead of incandescent bulbs, 41,550 pounds of carbon dioxide will be kept out of the environment, and this reduction will help to combat global warming.

Cool Cities Sunnyvale, the Volunteer Center of Silicon Valley, Acterra, and the Lakewood Village Neighborhood Association formed the partners for this bulb giveaway. November in Your Yard and Garden

- ☀️•Finish planting spring bulbs.
- ☀️Shop for native plants and set them in the garden.
- ☀️Complete fall cleanup in the garden.
- ☀️Despite the drop in the temperature, composting continues. Add disease-free leaves and chopped-up, dead annuals to the compost pile. Remember to keep the pile as damp as a wrung-out sponge for faster composting.
- ☀️Keep after the snails.
- ☀️Watch out for ants invading the house from the garden.
- ☀️Wrap vulnerable, young tree trunks, particularly citrus trees, with paper or burlap to protect them from freezing.
- ☀️Water plants as needed.
- ☀️Stabilize plants that might be harmed by autumn wind.
- ☀️Prune wisteria and clematis to control size and encourage new flowering wood in spring. Lightly prune forsythia.
- ☀️Water roses but withhold all fertilizer. When the ground freezes, mulch the rose bed heavily.
- ☀️Finish transplanting fall- and winter-flowering plants into the bedding plot.
- ☀️Harvest what is left of the summer vegetables before the rain and cold destroy them. Continue to plant the winter vegetable garden with cool-season

crops such as beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, onions, parsnips, and turnips. If you have put the vegetable garden to rest over the winter, cover it with manure so that the manure will age properly over the winter.

☀️Flush your watering system to remove mineral deposits. Soak all newly transplanted plants until the rains come.
