LOCATED ON MANZANO WAY, THIS NEW STYLE COUNTRY CLUB, DESIGNED FOR YEAR ROUND PLEASURE OF 300 FAMILIES AND THEIR GUESTS, WILL FEATURE AN ATTRACTIVE, MODERN CLUB HOUSE, THREE FREE-FORM SWIMMING POOLS, TENNIS OR BADMINTON COURTS, VOLLEYBALL COURTS, HORSESHOE PITCHING PITS, FENCED PLAY AREAS FOR CHILDREN, BARBEQUE PITS, & OTHER OUTDOOR-INDOOR FEATURES. K & H CONSTRUCTION COMPANY WILL CONSTRUCT THIS UNIQUE IDEA FOR FAMILY FUN, WHICH IS SCHEDULED FOR COMPLETION THE LATTER PART OF JUNE THIS YEAR.

LVRA MEETS 4TH

THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE LAKEWOOD VILLAGE RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION WILL BE HELD MONDAY, APRIL 4TH, AT 7:30 P.M., IN THE MULTI-PURPOSE ROOM AT FAIRWOOD SCHOOL.

THE ANNUAL REPORT FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS WILL BE PRESENTED. GUEST SPEAKER WILL BE E. N. STOUT, FORMER COUNCIL MEMBER OF SUNNYVALE, WHO WILL ADDRESS THE GROUP ABOUT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF THE CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS.

REFRESHMENTS WILL BE SERVED FOLLOWING THE MEETING.

LVRA RECOMMENDS GREENBELTING FOR LAKEWOOD VILLAGE-ORCHARD GARDENS AREA

AT THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING, MARCH 15TH, TED GLASNOW, REPRESENTING YOUR ASSOCIATION, RECOMMENDED THAT THE CITY OF SUNNYVALE HOLD THIS TWO HUNDRED ACRES IN RESERVE UNTIL THE MORE SUITABLE INDUSTRIAL AREAS ARE ALMOST FULL. IT WAS POINTED OUT THAT THIS WAS A SMALL AMOUNT TO HAVE AS A HEDGE AGAINST THE GENERAL PLAN OF FIVE THOUSAND ACRES FOR INDUSTRY, PARTICULARLY SINCE THIS PLAN HAS 25% INDUSTRIAL AND LESS THAN 42% RESIDENTIAL.

THE LVRA HAS MAINTAINED THAT THIS AREA SHOULD BE RESIDENTIAL, AS HAS THE COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION. FOR THE RESIDENTS HERE, THIS WOULD MEAN A BETTER SHOPPING CENTER, MORE AND BETTER SCHOOLS, INCREASED LAND VALUES, AND IN GENERAL A BETTER, MORE COMPLETE RESIDENTIAL AREA. TEMPORARY GREENBELTING WOULD ALLOW TIME TO PROVE US CORRECT OR INCORRECT AND IS PREFERABLE TO FACTORIES.

ANNUAL REPORT ON ACTIONS TAKEN DURING THE PAST YEAR

THE PAST YEAR HAS BEEN ONE OF ACCOMPLISHMENT. THE INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS AND COMMITTEES WHO HAVE WORKED TO MAKE THIS POSSIBLE ARE TO BE CONGRATULATED AND THANKED FOR THEIR WORK. THE CITY OFFICIALS WHO WENT OUT OF THEIR WAY TO HELP THE RESIDENTS HERE AND PROVIDE NEEDED SERVICES ARE DESERVING OF THANKS FROM ALL RESIDENTS.

OUR SOCIAL COMMITTEE HAS BEEN VERY ACTIVE IN THE RESIDENTS' BEHALF. (SEE SEPARATE REPORT)

A NEWSPAPER, THE VILLAGER, HAS BEEN PROVIDED AT NO COST TO ALL RESIDENTS AND TO CITY AND COUNTY OFFICIALS. A NEW TYPEWRITER AND PAPER CUTTER HAS BEEN PURCHASED FOR NEWSPAPER USE.

WE HAVE CO-SPONSORED A FORUM FOR CANDIDATES TO THE CITY COUNCIL AND PARTICIPATED IN THE COMMUNITY FAIR.


IN GENERAL, THE ASSOCIATION HAS WORKED TO IMPROVE THE AREA AND RAISE THE INDIVIDUAL HOME VALUES.

SPECIFICALLY, 25-MILE PER HOUR ZONE SIGNS WERE ADDED AT OUR REQUEST AND SPECIAL POLICE PATROLS WERE ADDED

TO STOP SPEEDERS. WE FOUGHT FOR RESIDENTIAL ZONING BETWEEN ORCHARD GARDENS AND LAKEWOOD VILLAGE, AND SUPPORTED A TEENAGE CLUB. WE HAVE SUPPORTED A LITTLE LEAGUE CLUB, AND PROVIDED MONEY FOR ARTS AND CRAFTS DURING THE SUMMER VACATION. WE HAVE HAD REPRESENTATIVES ATTENDING CIVIC COMMITTEES, BOARDS, AND THE CITY COUNCIL. THESE REPRESENTATIVES "PUSHED" LANDSCAPING AND PAINTING OUR SCHOOLS, A BETTER PARK AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, ZONING, ADDED CITY SERVICES, STOP SIGNS NEAR SCHOOLS, LOWERING LAWRENCE STATION ROAD, AND PAVING OF LAKEHAVEN.

MANY LETTERS WERE WRITTEN ON THE ABOVE TOPICS, AND ON OTHERS, SUCH AS A LEFT HAND TURN LANE OFF OF BAYSHORE, POWER FAILURES HERE, THE SOUR SMELL DURING CANNING SEASON, AND ON STRAY DOGS. WE HAVE WORKED WITH THE CITY ON CRICKET PROBLEMS. THE LAND BEHIND THE HOMES IS NOW DISKED AND THERE IS LESS TRASH THERE SINCE WE BURNED IT. TREES WERE CUT DOWN AT THE INTERSECTION OF THE MOUNTAIN VIEW-ALVISO ROAD AND LAWRENCE STATION ROAD SO THAT VISIBILITY IS BETTER.

WE ARE NOW INCORPORATED AND HAVE BETTER BY-LAWS TO MAKE OUR ASSOCIATION MORE EFFECTIVE. AT OUR MEETINGS WE HAVE HAD SPEAKERS ON TOPICS OF LOCAL INTEREST. (CONT'D PAGE 4)

FOR THE SALE OF GOODS, WARES AND
MERCHANDISE, NEWSPAPERS, BOOKS,

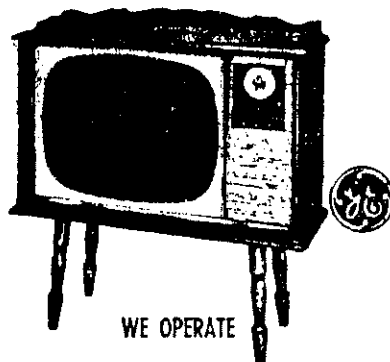
