Company Meat Loaf

- 1 pound ground beef
- ½ pound bulk pork sausage
- 1 egg
- ½ cup milk
- ½ cup fine dry bread crumbs
- ½ cup finely chopped onion
- 1¼ teaspoons salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- ¼ teaspoon thyme
- 6 canned peach halves
- Catsup

Combine beef and pork sausage. Add well-beaten egg, milk, bread crumbs, onion, salt, pepper and thyme. Blend thoroughly. Spread mixture in a well-greased 8 x 8-inch square pan. Make 6 indentations for the peaches. Bake in a 350° F. oven for 35 minutes. Remove from oven, spoon off fat and place well-drained peach halves in hollows. Fill peaches

Devilled Meat Loaf

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 cup soft bread crumbs
- 3 tablespoons prepared mustard
- 2 tablespoons horse-radish
- 1 tablespoon minced onion
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 1 beaten egg
- ¼ cup catsup

- 1 teaspoon dry mustard
- 2 tablespoons vinegar

Combine all except last four ingredients, blending thoroughly. Mix remaining ingredients for the topping and pour into a meat loaf pan, spreading out to the corners. Pack ham loaf mixture carefully but firmly on top. Bake at 350° F. for 1¼ hours. Let stand for 10 minutes. Drain off juice and turn out on a serving platter. Serves 6.

Serve with: whipped sweet potatoes; spinach; carrot and raisin salad; baked custard.
