bread dressing. Pinch edges together before cooking.

6. Frying is the easiest method for cooking hamburgers. However, they may be broiled if the patties are not too thin.

7. A good seasoning tip when broiling hamburgers—after patties have been turned, spread with catsup or chili sauce or with butter that has been blended with crumbled bleu or American cheese. Continue broiling until done.

FIRE STATION NEWS....

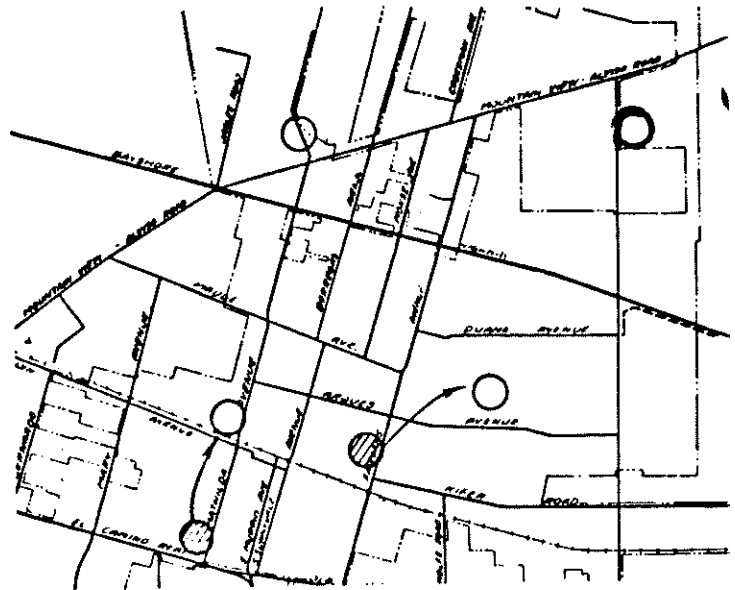
LADIES AND GENTLEMEN OF LAKEWOOD VILLAGE. AFTER ATTENDING THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING, MARCH 20TH, WE OF THE FIRE STATION COMMITTEE HAVE THIS TO REPORT TO YOU. A FULL REPORT WAS GIVEN BY THIS COMMITTEE TO THE COUNCIL; INCLUDED IN THIS REPORT WERE SUCH FACTS AS THE DISTANCE BEING 4.3 MILES FROM THE NEAREST FIRE STATION WHICH IS LOCATED ON FAIROAKS AND ARGUES. THE AVERAGE RUNNING TIME WAS SIX MINUTES DURING THE YEAR OF 1961.

WE NATURALLY EMPHASIZED THE NEED OF A STATION HERE IN THE VILLAGE AND EXPLAINED WHY THE STATION AT FAIROAKS AND THE PROPOSED STATION NEAR LOCKHEED WOULD NOT SOLVE OUR PROBLEM. WE FURTHER EMPHASIZED THE NEED OF A STATION BY OUR INDUSTRY AND SCHOOLS.

Don't forget the Gravy



One of the best accompaniments for a roast or braised meat dish is plenty of good brown gravy. Perfect gravy is easy to make. After a little experience, you can do it without even a sidelong glance at a measuring cup. But at first it pays to measure ingredients carefully.

Pot Roast Gravy

1. Remove meat from pan to hot platter.
 2. Pour all liquid and fat into separate container. Meat juices and cooking liquid will settle to bottom. Fat will rise to top.
 3. Skim off fat with spoon, returning only 4 tablespoons to pan.
 4. Heat fat and stir in 4 tablespoons flour gradually.
 5. Add two cups of cooking liquid and meat juices. If necessary, add enough water to make this quantity.
 6. Cook over low heat, stirring constantly until smooth and thickened. Scrape bottom of pan to loosen any meat particles.
 7. Season to taste with salt and pepper and, if desired, a dash of Worcestershire sauce, pinch of herbs or a spoonful of horse-radish.
- For onion gravy, lightly brown finely sliced or minced onions in fat before adding flour.

Gravy from Oven Roasts

In making gravy from an average-sized rib roast of beef or pork, veal and lamb roasts, the procedure is slightly different from the above. As no water is added to the roast during cooking, only fat and drippings are left in the pan.

Skim off all but two or three tablespoons of fat; stir in 2 or 3 tablespoons flour and slowly add 1 to 1½ cups water. Cook over low heat until well thickened, stirring constantly. Season to taste. (When a rib roast of beef is cooked to the rare stage, there will be few drippings and it will not yield much gravy. In this case use less fat, flour and liquid.)

Hamburgers



General Pointers in Preparing Hamburgers

1. It is not necessary to use round steak for hamburgers, as the less expensive ground chuck is just as satisfactory. In fact, many people prefer chuck to round because it contains more fat and makes a juicier hamburger. High quality, ready-ground hamburger also may be used.
2. Use 1 teaspoon salt and 1/8 teaspoon pepper for each pound of ground beef.
3. For extra-juicy hamburgers, add 1/4 cup water or evaporated milk per pound of meat.
4. Add some finely chopped onion, if desired, also one or several of the following seasonings: Worcestershire sauce, mustard, catsup, thyme, poultry seasoning, caraway seed, horse-radish. Or add 1/4 cup finely chopped nuts or parsley to each pound of meat.
5. A good variation in preparing hamburgers is to put two thin hamburger patties together with well-seasoned

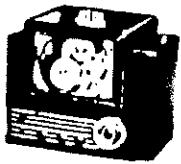
