

FIRE STATION FOR LAKEWOOD VILLAGE

AT THE APRIL 10TH SUNNYVALE CITY COUNCIL MEETING A VERY IMPORTANT DECISION WAS ARRIVED TO LAKEWOOD VILLAGE. THE L.V.R.A. WAS RECOMMENDED FOR OUR INTEREST IN CIVIC AFFAIRS AND IN SHOWING A DEFINITE NEED FOR FIRE STATIONS NOT ONLY IN LAKEWOOD VILLAGE BUT THROUGHOUT SUNNYVALE. AT THIS MEETING IT WAS DECIDED THAT STATIONS #4 (WOLFF RD. AND QUINCY) #5 (NEAR LOCKHEED) AND #6 (LAKEWOOD VILLAGE AREA) WOULD BE CONSTRUCTED AND COMPLETED DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 1962. I HAD HOPED THAT STATION #6 WOULD BE STARTED FIRST BUT AS IT IS, THE DECISION OF THE COUNCIL WAS SUCH THAT NO ONE STATION WILL BE STARTED FIRST BUT THAT THEY ALL WILL BEGIN CONSTRUCTION AT THE SAME TIME.

I PERSONALLY FEEL THAT THE DECISION WAS GOOD ENOUGH, AS WE DID ACCOMPLISH THE MAJOR PORTION OF OUR TASK. THE STATION FOR LAKEWOOD VILLAGE WILL BE LOCATED AT LAWRENCE EXPRESS-WAY AND ELKO RD. FOR THOSE WHO ARE NOT FAMILIAR WITH THIS LOCATION IT IS THE SIDE STREET INTO THE INDUSTRIAL AREA BEFORE YOU REACH MT. VIEW ALVISO RD. IT WILL BE ON THE CORNER. ANOTHER THING WE WERE TOLD, THESE STATIONS ARE BEING PAID FOR BY BONDS WHICH WERE PASSED IN 1961, THIS MEANS NO TAX INCREASE. AT THIS TIME I WOULD LIKE TO PERSONALLY THANK THE FOLLOWING PEOPLE WHO GAVE UP THEIR TIME IN ORDER THAT THIS COMMITTEE WAS ABLE

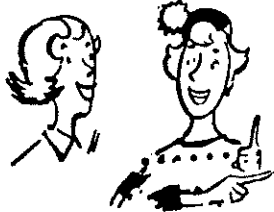

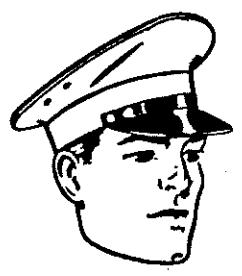
OUR LADY OF PEACE PARISH-LADIES GUILD

PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGES

THE FOLLOWING BY-LAW CHANGES ARE RECOMMENDED BY YOUR BY-LAWS COMMITTEE. THESE CHANGES ARE PRESENTED HERE IN COMPLIANCE WITH ARTICLE X. A. WHICH REQUIRES WRITTEN NOTICE TO ALL MEMBERS PRIOR TO THE VOTE. THESE CHANGES WILL BE VOTED UPON AT THE JUNE 4TH MEETING SINCE ITEM A. ALSO REQUIRES A MINIMUM OF 15 DAYS WRITTEN NOTICE. ADOPTION REQUIRES 2/3 APPROVAL, A QUORUM (14 MEMBERS) PRESENT, OF THE GENERAL MEETING.

CHANGE 1

ARTICLE I - QUALIFICATIONS, ETC
PROVIDES THAT IN THE EVENT OF LIQUIDATION, MONEY SHALL BE DONATED TO A NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION OR CHARITY.

THE COMMITTEE WANTS THIS ITEM DISCUSSED AT THE GENERAL MEETING. A FEELING WAS EXPRESSED THAT, TO KEEP ANY SUCH MONEY WITHIN THE VILLAGE, DONATION(S) TO LOCAL SCHOOL(S) MIGHT BE MORE APPROPRIATE. THE COMMITTEE REACHED NO CONCLUSION.

THE REMAINDER OF THE PROPOSED CHANGES ARE UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDED FOR APPROVAL BY THE BY-LAWS COMMITTEE.

CHANGE 2

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP

1. ELIGIBILITY
1. "PERSON MUST BE A RESIDENT OF LAKEWOOD VILLAGE AND LAKEWOOD PARK."

THE COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS "A RESIDENT OR OWNER OF REAL PROPERTY IN LAKEWOOD VILLAGE OR LAKEWOOD PARK."

CHANGE 3

RULES OF CONDUCT
PROVIDES THAT NO MEMBER MAY STATE ANY OPINION FOR, SPEAK FOR, SOLICIT OR RAISE MONEY FOR, OR OBLIGATE THE LVRA "UNLESS AUTHORIZED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS."

THE PROPOSED CHANGE IS "UNLESS AUTHORIZED BY A MINIMUM OF EIGHT MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS."

CHANGE 4

**ARTICLE III - OFFICERS
DUTIES**

3. SECRETARY

D. "SMALL KEEP AN UP-TO-DATE ROLL OF THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP AND CALL SAID ROLL UPON PROPER REQUEST."

CALLING THE ROLL WITH THE PRESENT SEVERAL HUNDRED MEMBERS IS NOT FEASIBLE. THIS WOULD BE CHANGED TO "AND HAVE IT AVAILABLE AT ALL GENERAL MEETINGS."

CHANGE 5

4. TREASURER

ADD:

G. "MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS." THIS IS IMPLIED BY THE BY-LAWS AND UNDERSTOOD BY THE MEMBERSHIP, BUT SINCE SPECIFIED FOR THE OTHER GENERAL OFFICERS, SHOULD BE ADDED.

CHANGE 6

D. "THE ELECTED OFFICERS SHALL HOLD OFFICE FOR ONE YEAR."

TO CLARIFY AND NOT BE INTERPRETED AS A NO-SECOND-TERM CLAUSE, "OFFICERS SHALL BE ELECTED ANNUALLY."

CHANGE 7

E. "THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY CAN RECOMMEND BY RESOLUTION, AN ACTION TO BE TAKEN BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS."

THIS REALLY CARRIED LITTLE WEIGHT. THE PROPOSED CHANGE IS, "THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL GIVE SERIOUS CONSIDERATION TO ANY RESOLUTION RECOMMENDED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY."

CHANGE 8

F. REQUIRES THE BOARD REPORT DECISIONS OR ACTION "AT THE FOLLOWING GENERAL MEETING"

ACTION IS NOT TAKEN BY THE BOARD AT THE FOLLOWING GENERAL MEETING. CHANGE TO READ, "• REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY • ACTIONS TAKEN AT THE PREVIOUS BOARD MEETING."

• TO PROVIDE FOR A BETTER METHOD OF AUDIT, THE FOLLOWING ADDITION IS RECOMMENDED. THE BOOKS SHALL BE AUDITED BY . . . "OR AN OUTSIDE AGENCY MAY BE HIRED WITH ONLY AN AUDIT CHAIRMAN APPOINTED TO SERVE AS LIAISON AND PRESENT THE REPORT, UPON APPROVAL OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY."

FOOD FOR EVACUATION OR SHELTER

WHETHER you evacuate or take shelter in an emergency, one of the basic preparations recommended is an adequate food supply for your family. You should assemble a 2-week food supply in your home shelter area, and a 3-day evacuation-survival kit in your family automobile. This precaution might mean the difference between comfort and hardship—even between survival and starvation—in case of enemy attack or a natural disaster.

An H-bomb explosion can blanket an area many miles downwind with dangerous radioactive fallout. Following enemy attack, essential services such as gas, electricity, and water, as well as normal channels of food distribution, would be disrupted. If this should happen, a family probably would have to depend wholly upon its own food and resources for survival. An emergency food storage could be the family's only available supply of food.

Start your home food storage and family shelter programs today. Your State or Community Civil Defense will supply you with other information about family preparedness.

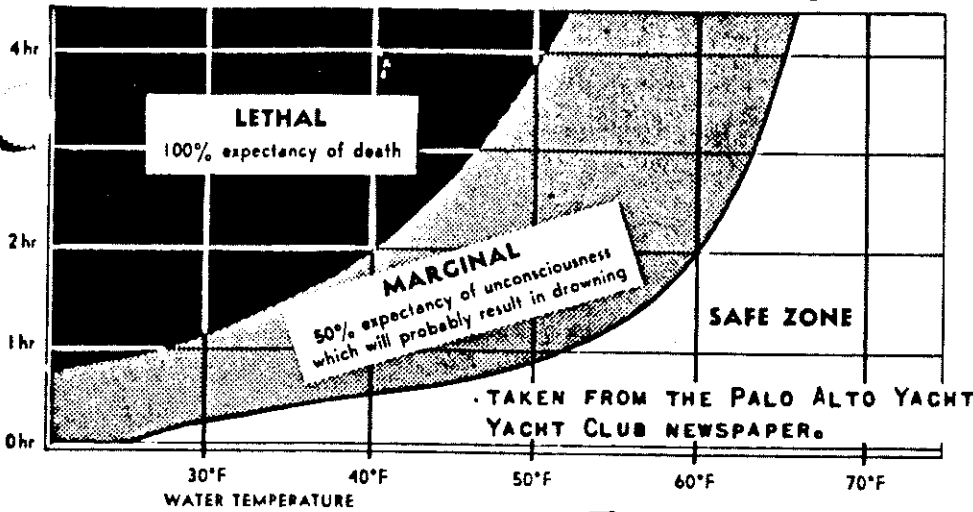

SAFETY BULLETIN

We all carry the legal number of life jackets but did you ever stop to think that these can do only one thing - keep your head above water. The chart shown here, reproduced from ENSIGN, shows your chances of survival in the water as determined by the length of exposure and water temperature. Note that at 50°F the safe zone allows only one hour. Bay water probably is not much above 50° during a large part of the winter! Remember it is just as important to be able to attract attention by radio, flares, smoke signals, etc. Be prepared!

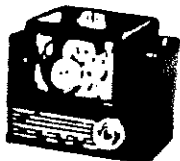

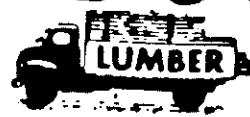
