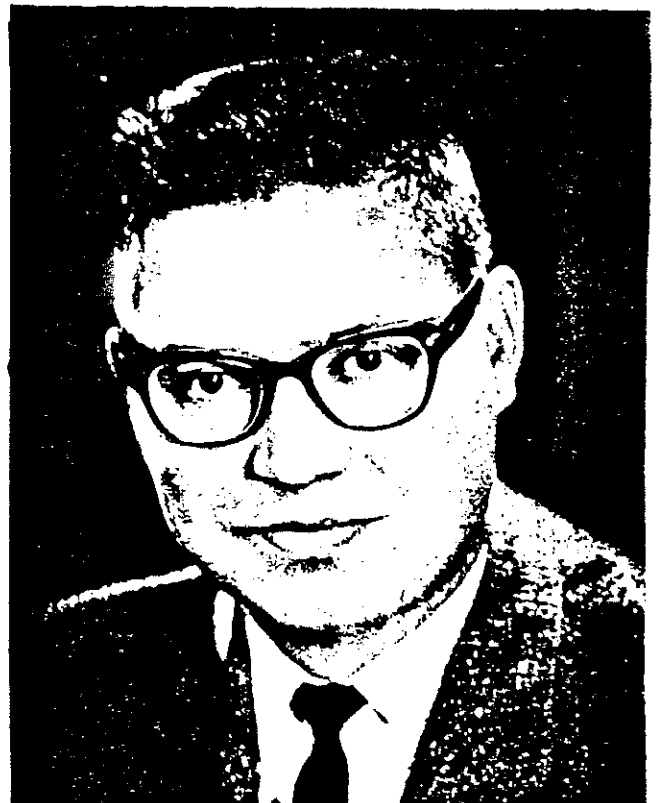

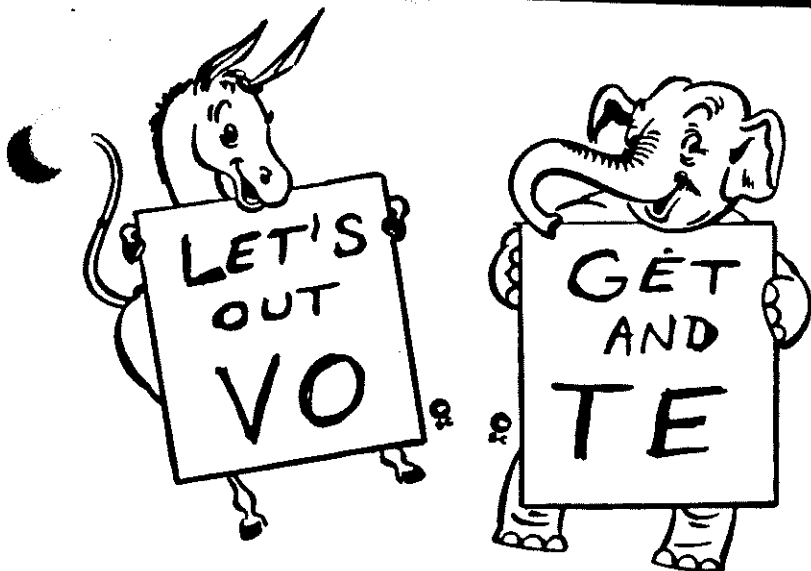

#### POISON PREVENTION

THE THIRD WEEK IN MARCH WAS "NATIONAL POISON PREVENTION WEEK." BUT HOW ABOUT THE OTHER 51 WEEKS OF THE YEAR? HOW ABOUT THE GRUESOME FACT THAT MORE CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF FIVE DIE FROM POISONING ACCIDENTS THAN FROM DIPHTEHRIA, POLIO, TYPHOID, MEASLES AND SCARLET FEVER COMBINED?

WE MUST ALL KEEP REMINDING OURSELVES THAT CHILDREN ARE EXPLORERS. THEY INVESTIGATE EVERYTHING THEY SEE--AND PART OF THE PROCESS AS A RESULT UNDOUBTABLY LEADS TO PUTTING THINGS IN THE MOUTH.

FOR THE SAFETY OF BOTH CHILDREN AND ADULTS,

IT IS IMPORTANT TO:

1. STORE ALL MEDICINES AND ALL HOUSEHOLD PREPARATIONS (CLEANING AND POLISHING AGENTS, KEROSENE, INSECTICIDES, ETC.) OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN AND IN LOCKED CABINETS IF POSSIBLE.
  2. NEVER CALL MEDICINE "CANDY."
  3. DON'T TAKE MEDICINE YOURSELF IN THE PRESENCE OF A CHILD BECAUSE YOUNG CHILDREN TEND TO IMITATE "GROWNUPS."
  4. DON'T STORE ANYTHING POISONOUS IN A CONTAINER THAT ONCE HELD FOOD OR DRINK. THE POP BOTTLE THAT HOLDS KEROSENE MAY FIND ITS WAY TO A CHILD'S LIPS.
  5. REMEMBER THAT PRODUCTS LEFT, EVEN MOMENTARILY, ON A SINK, A BEDSIDE TABLE OR IN YOUR PURSE ARE NOT OUT OF REACH.
  6. CLEAN OUT MEDICINE CABINETS REGULARLY. THROW AWAY PRESCRIPTION ITEMS WHEN THE ILLNESS FOR WHICH THEY WERE GIVEN IS PAST.
  7. DISPOSE OF MEDICINES AND HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTS BY FLUSHING THEM DOWN THE TOILET. RINSE THE CONTAINERS BEFORE DISCARDING THEM.
  8. IF YOU SUSPECT THAT ANYONE HAS SWALLOWED ANY TOXIC SUBSTANCE, CALL YOUR DOCTOR AT ONCE. DO NOT WAIT FOR SYMPTOMS TO APPEAR.
- THESE PRECAUTIONS SEEM SO SENSIBLE AND SO OBVIOUS. NOW LET'S ALL REMEMBER THEM AND PROTECT OUR FAMILIES FROM POTENTIAL HARM.

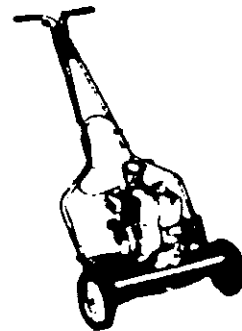

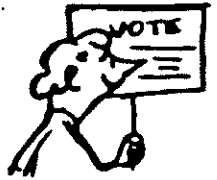

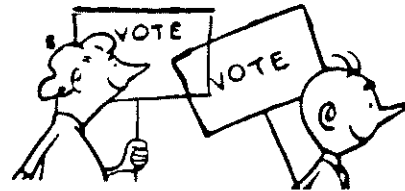
