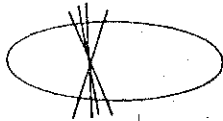
## PRESIDENTS CORNER -

THE SPEAKER OF THE EVENING WAS THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF SAN JOSE TEACHERS ASSN., MR. GARY CLARK. HE GAVE A BRIEF, BUT DIRECT EXPLANATION OF THE PITFALLS IN PROP. NO. 9. HE URGED ALL CONCERNED VOTERS TO VOTE NO ON PROP. 9. THIS WAS OF PARTICULAR INTEREST TO THE BENNER EXECUTIVE BOARD, BECAUSE AT OUR LAST MEETING ON OCT. 16 WE REVIEWED THE FACTS AND VOTED TO TAKE AN OFFICIAL STAND AGAINST PROP. 9.

## NON-PARTISAN ELECTION SPECIAL BY THE LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS OF CALIFORNIA PROPOSITION 9 Taxation. Limitation of Property Tax

### ARGUMENTS FOR THE MEASURE

1. Property taxes would be lowered an average of 50%, and the small home-owner would benefit.
2. Property taxes should be used only for those expenses which relate to and benefit the property; property owners should not be forced to pay a larger portion of educational and welfare costs than other people.
3. This measure would force much-needed tax reform.
4. The property tax payer will receive some immediate relief, while the Legislature is given five years to make fiscal adjustments.

### ARGUMENTS AGAINST THE MEASURE

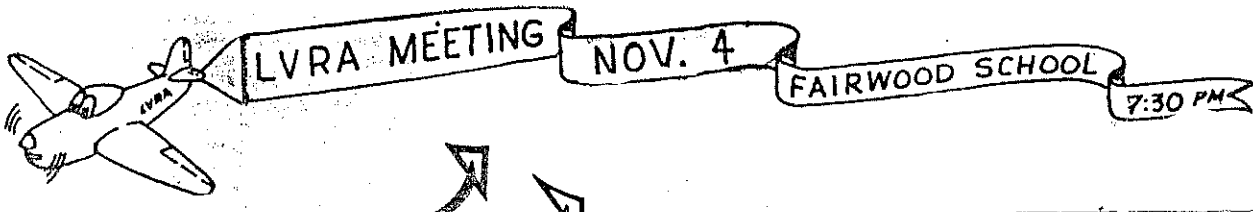
1. The resulting increases in other taxes would more than offset this property tax reduction, and would hit hardest those least able to pay. Business and large landowners would benefit more than the small home-owner.
2. Since the property owner has more at stake in the community, it is only right that he should pay more for those things which increase the value of the community as a whole, such as education and welfare.
3. This measure takes away local control because it removes the possibility of a tax override, even if the local electorate should want it; and, by forcing the State to pay for education, it gives control of schools to the State instead of leaving control with the local community.
4. The wording is so ambiguous that the proposed bond limitation could impair the ability of local governments to finance needed capital projects, and might even delay completion of present development projects, such as the State Water Plan.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OCTOBER LVRA MEETING

Four speakers were present at the October LVRA meeting: Mayor Hayden, Traffic Engineer Lee Yarborough, and Mrs. Marie Evans, Library Board, and Mr. Dorwin, candidate for the seat of an assemblyman, 24th district. All talks were followed by question-and-answer periods.

Mr. Hayden commented on the good liaison he has with our association, which, as he said, is the most active homeowners' association in Sunnyvale. He mentioned the large number of youngsters he saw at our Western Days. Their interest in this event, he felt, was a great tribute to the LVRA.

Mayor Hayden explained the structure of the Sunnyvale city government, which is somewhat unusual in that the mayor is the ceremonial head of the city, whereas actual city business is conducted by the City Manager, Mr. Dever. Office of the mayor is an honorary position, for which one of the city councilmen is chosen each year. This position, he said, provides a good opportunity to meet many people, but does not necessarily call for an expert on city matters.

Mr. Hayden spoke on the impact of Prop. 9 - if passed - on City finances. Over the next 5 years, planned S.V. projects - the community center, two new parks, and library and public safety buildings - will cost \$5,265,000, while all possible revenue for these projects only adds up to \$4,310,000. If the Proposition is passed, Sunnyvale will not be able to sell needed bonds, even though they had been approved at the last bond issue three years ago to be sold over a period of 7 years. The City has proposed a minimum business tax of \$100 and 1% tax on utility bills (which will amount to \$3.36 per year for the average household), but these measures will not make up for the loss in property

taxes thru Prop. 9. Mr. Hayden pointed out that, while property tax portions for county and schools had gone up in the past, the portion for the city had remained the same for a number of years.

Mrs. Marie Evans spoke on the library, which now contains 119,368 books. She gave a useful bit of information, that the S.V. library cards may also be used in Santa Clara and San Jose libraries due to a reciprocal arrangement. Mrs. Evans mentioned the unique Patent Library on Fair Oaks Avenue, which is the only one of its kind outside of Washington, D.C. In answer to questions, Mrs. Evans said that a Lakewood Village branch library cannot be considered before a new budget will be drawn up in January. In the meantime, Lakewood Park is the site for the federally supported teen library, which consists of spinner racks.

Mr. Yarborough spoke of projects now under study: the widening of the overpass which will accommodate 4 lanes, with pedestrian walks on both sides. A high outside railing will be provided for protection, as well as painted crosswalks over the 4 access routes to Bayshore. At the request of Steve Coolley, a traffic study was undertaken on two crossings: Meadowlake-Lakehaven and Sandia-Fairwood. Crosswalks on all important intersections were painted and maps indicating safe routes from school to home will be distributed to children by their teachers after classroom discussion. Parents will also be advised of the best routes for their children. An accident analysis is still going on.

Mr. Dorwin spoke briefly in behalf of his campaign and promised to come back for the November LVRA meeting.

CONTAINERS COME IN ALL SHAPES AND SIZES. YOU CAN GET A LARGE CERAMIC ONE WITH A SMALL LAMP BEHIND IT OR YOU CAN USE THE OLD COMMON CLAY POT IN A SAUCER.

THE WEAK SPOT IN IN-DOOR GARDENING IS SUPPLYING MOISTURE. IF YOU CAN CONTROL THIS; YOU HAVE A GOOD CHANCE ON HAVING A HEALTHY PLANT. THIS IS ESPECIALLY TRUE WHEN THE PLANT IS IN A CONTAINER WITHOUT A DRAINAGE HOLE.

YOU CAN OFF-SET THIS PROBLEM BY USING A LAYER OF CHARCOAL ON THE BOTTOM OF THE CONTAINER AND PLACING A LAYER OF PEAT MOSS ON TOP OF THAT. YOU CAN BUY COMMERCIAL DRAINAGE MATERIAL IF YOU WISH.

KNOWING WHEN TO WATER TAKES SOME GETTING USE TO. YOU WANT TO FILL YOUR SPONGY BOTTOM, ONLY; OR YOU HAVE AN OVERWATERING PROBLEM. UNTIL YOU GET USE TO YOUR PLANTS WATERING HABITS USE THIS RULE-OF-THUMB. USE THE SOIL BENEATH THE SURFACE AS AN INDICATOR. WITHHOLDING WATER UNTIL IT IS NO LONGER MOIST.

MAYBE YOUR SCHEDULE WILL GO LIKE THIS! SMALL CONTAINERS, TWICE A WEEK; LARGE CONTAINERS, EVERY WEEK OR TWO, DEPENDING ON PLANT GROWTH.

YOU SHOULD PLACE THESE PLANTS IN A NORTH LIGHT. ABSOLUTELY NO DIRECT MIDDAY SUNLIGHT. VARIEGATED (SPOTTED OR SEVERAL COLORED) LEAVES ALWAYS NEED MORE LIGHT THAN SOLID GREEN LEAVES. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES SHOULD THESE PLANTS BE MOVED OUTDOORS, EVEN FOR A BRIEF TIME.

IF YOU HAVE GOTTEN A POTTED PLANT THE ORIGINAL POTTING MIXTURE IS RICH ENOUGH IN NUTRIENTS, THAT THE PLANT WON'T NEED ANY FERTILIZER UNTIL THE ROOTS START FILLING THE CONTAINER. IF YOU THINK YOU NEEDED SOME FERTILIZER USE A COMMERCIAL TYPE FOR IN-DOOR PLANTS.

NOW, IF YOU HAVEN'T BEEN SO-RED OFF BY NOW, HERE IS ONE LAST WORD ON IN-DOOR PLANTING. WASH THE DUST OFF THE LEAVES. A DUSTY LEAF CAN'T BREATHE WELL. USE A DAMP SOFT CLOTH OR SPONGE ONCE OR TWICE A MONTH AND WIPE EACH LEAF GENTLY. TO MAKE YOUR LEAVES SHINE, USE SKIMMED (NON-FAT) MILK OR A VERY MILD SOAP & WATER SOLUTION. BUT, BE SURE TO WATER A COUPLE OF HOURS BEFORE DOING THIS.

NOVEMBER IS STILL CLEAN-UP TIME. THE RAINS HAVE STARTED AND NOW IT WILL BE MESSY CLEANING UP LEAVES, OLD BLOOMS AND DEAD FRUIT.

PLANT YOUR SPRING-BLOOMING BULBS, PERENNIALS AND BIENNIALS FROM NURSERY FLATS; SCRUB AND TREES.

YOU CAN STILL SQUEEZE IN YOUR LAWN IF YOU WANT TO PLANT IT IN TIME FOR THE FIRST RAINS.

CUT YOUR PEONIES BACK AFTER THE FOLIAGE DIES. LIFT YOUR GLADIOLUS BULBS AND DUST WITH DOT DUST TO KILL THRIPS OR MITES.

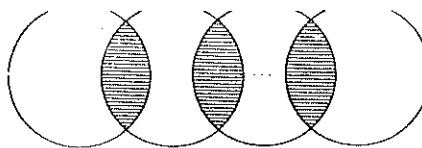

IT OFFERS SCREENING TESTS AND EDUCATION SPECIFICALLY FOR THOSE TWO SERIOUS DISEASES PLUS SCREENING PROCEDURES FOR HEART DISEASE AND RESPIRATORY DISEASE. CURRENTLY THE CLINIC IS OPERATING THE FIRST AND THIRD WEDNESDAY OF EACH MONTH AND APPOINTMENTS ARE MADE BY CALLING THE OFFICE LOCATED AT 660 SOUTH FAIR OAKS AVENUE, 732-5100.

ALL PERSONS WHO HAVE HAD A FAMILY MEMBER DIAGNOSED BY A PHYSICIAN FOR DIABETES OR GLAUCOMA ARE NOT ACCEPTED, BUT ANYONE ELSE OVER 30 YEARS OF AGE IS ENCOURAGED TO APPLY FOR AN APPOINTMENT WHICH WILL BE GIVEN AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. ALSO, ANYONE OVER 21 BUT UNDER 30 WHO HAS A FAMILY HISTORY OF DIABETES IS ACCEPTED.

A GENERAL REPORT OF THE RESULTS OF TESTS IS SENT TO THE PATIENT WITHIN TEN DAYS OF THE CLINIC AND A FULL REPORT IS MADE TO THEIR PRIVATE PHYSICIAN. A FOLLOW-UP VISIT TO A PRIVATE PHYSICIAN IS ENCOURAGED PARTICULARLY IF SERIOUS TEST RESULTS SHOW UP. A YEARLY REPEAT OF THE SCREENING CLINIC IS ALSO RECOMMENDED.

IN OFFERING THIS PUBLIC SERVICE THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT IS ASSISTED BY VOLUNTEERS WHO HELP STAFF THE CLINIC AND PLAN ITS DEVELOPMENT.
