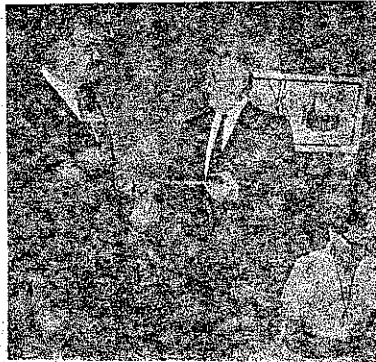

A CAR POOL FORMED TO TRANSPORT "BODIES" TO THE PLANNING COMMISSION MEETING IN SANTA CLARA, WHICH WAS TO BE HELD ON WEDNESDAY.

IN THREE DAYS AN ACCOMPLISHMENT OF GREAT PROPORTION WAS CARRIED THROUGH TO A SATISFACTORY CONCLUSION. FRIENDS AND NEIGHBORS FROM ORCHARD GARDENS, MOBILE HOMES, FROM ACROSS BAYSHORE, BUSINESSES AND INDUSTRIES, SANTA CLARA AND LAKEWOOD VILLAGE RESIDENTS, THANK YOU.

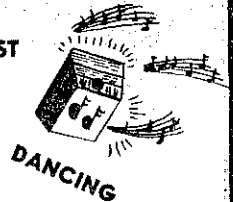

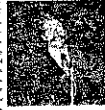

"PEOPLE POWER"

REMEMBER APRIL 13 FOR IT WAS NOT ONLY THOMAS JEFFERSON'S BIRTHDAY BUT ALSO THE DAY LAST MONTH THAT OVER 350 FRIENDS AND NEIGHBORS CAME TOGETHER TO UNITE AGAINST THE PROPOSED SLAUGHTER HOUSE NEXT TO LAKEWOOD VILLAGE. THIS MEETING WAS IN THE TRUE SPIRIT OF DEMOCRACY, WHERE PEOPLE COME TOGETHER TO WORK FOR SOLUTIONS TO COMMON PROBLEMS THEY FACE. THIS SPIRIT WHICH PEOPLE THAT NIGHT CALLED "PEOPLE POWER" PROVED ONCE AGAIN THAT THOMAS JEFFERSON WAS RIGHT AND THAT DEMOCRACY REALLY DOES WORK.

WITH OUR NEW COMMUNITY SCHOOL PROGRAM, WE HAVE SEEN OTHER INDICATIONS THAT DEMOCRACY WORKS. FOR EXAMPLE, THE LAKEWOOD CO-OP PRE-SCHOOL RAN TOTALLY BY HOMEMAKERS COMING TOGETHER TO HELP EACH OTHER. THE NOW PROGRAM WHERE PEOPLE HAVE COME TOGETHER TO SHARE KNOWLEDGE IN SEWING, CAKE DECORATING, CROCHETING, KNITTING, BASIC ELECTRONICS, AUTO BASICS, CRAFTS, PAINTING, BALLET, TUMBLING, AND MANY OTHER AREAS OF SPECIFICATION AND KNOWLEDGE ALSO PROVES THAT "PEOPLE CAN COME TOGETHER TO HELP EACH OTHER. ANOTHER PERFECT EXAMPLE IS THE LAKEWOOD YOUTH BASEBALL WHICH IS THE BEST YOUTH BASEBALL SYSTEM I HAVE EVER SEEN. THIS BASEBALL PROGRAM DEVELOPED A FEW YEARS AGO IS AN EXCELLENT TRIBUTE TO THE IDEALS OF THOMAS JEFFERSON AND DEMOCRACY. ANOTHER WAY THE PEOPLE OF LAKEWOOD VILLAGE AND ORCHARD GARDENS ARE PIONEERING THE REVIVAL OF DEMOCRACY IS IN USING OUR SCHOOLS AS COMMUNITY CENTERS WHERE AGENCIES AND THE PEOPLE THEY SERVE CAN DEVELOP RELEVANT PROGRAMS TO MEET THEIR NEEDS. AT THE PRESENT TIME BOY SCOUTS, GIRL SCOUTS, CALIF. AGRICULTURE EXTENSION, DE ANZA COLLEGE, FOOTHILL COLLEGE, SUNNYVALE PUBLIC SAFETY, SUNNYVALE PARKS AND RECREATION, SUNNYVALE COMMUNITY SERVICE, SAN JOSE STATE COLLEGE, YMCA, MENTAL HEALTH, PUBLIC HEALTH, SANTA CLARA COUNTY PROBATION DEPT. AND, OF COURSE, OUR SCHOOL DISTRICT ARE SHARING THE USE OF OUR SCHOOLS IN TRANSFORMING THEM INTO COMMUNITY CENTERS.

AT A TIME WHEN DEMOCRACY IS UNDER ATTACK FROM WITH OUT AND FROM WITH IN, THE PEOPLE OF LAKEWOOD VILLAGE AND ORCHARD GARDENS ARE SHOWING THE REST OF THE COUNTRY WHAT PEOPLE-POWER AND DEMOCRACY ARE ALL ABOUT. WE HAVE JUST BEGUN AND IN THE FORTH COMING MONTHS WE WILL BE DEVELOPING EVEN MORE MODELS THAT PAY TRIBUTE TO THOMAS JEFFERSON AND HIS IDEALS.

LAKEWOOD PARENT PRESCHOOL

THREE MONTHS HAVE GONE BY SINCE "THE LAKEWOOD PARENT PRESCHOOL" OPENED ON FEBRUARY 8TH. THE PRESCHOOL PROJECT HAS BLOSSOMED WITH 48 CHILDREN IN THE 5 DAY PROGRAM. MRS. NETTI WISE, IS DIRECTOR-TEACHER AND JUDY CARDELL, IS CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD.

THIS SCHOOL SERVES THE LAKEWOOD COMMUNITY BY PROVIDING AN ENVIRONMENT FOR GOOD INTELLECTUAL, EMOTIONAL AND PHYSICAL GROWTH. IT ALSO PROVIDES AN OPPORTUNITY FOR MOTHERS, TEACHERS AND CHILDREN TO WORK TOGETHER AND TO LEARN TO CO-OPERATED WITH AND SHOW CONSIDERATION FOR THOSE OF VARYING BACKGROUNDS.

THE LIBRARY PROGRAM HAS PROVIDED OVER 75 BOOKS SUPPLIED BY THE SUNNYVALE LIBRARY AND A READING PROGRAM BY SUNNYVALE LIBRARIAN, MRS. MIRIEL STEROCHE, TWICE A MONTH.

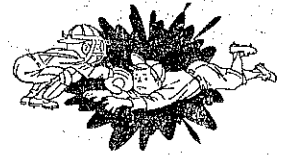

CALIFORNIA LAW REQUIRES ALL CHILDREN ENROLLING IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS HAVE VERIFICATION OF IMMUNIZATION AGAINST POLIO AND MEASLES. EXEMPTIONS PERMITTED BY LAW ARE FOR REASONS OF HEALTH OR BELIEF. IMMUNIZATION FOR MEASLES IS NOT REQUIRED WHERE THE PARENT VERIFIES THAT THE CHILD HAS HAD MEASLES.

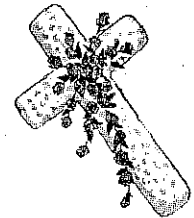

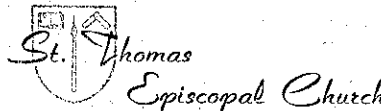
