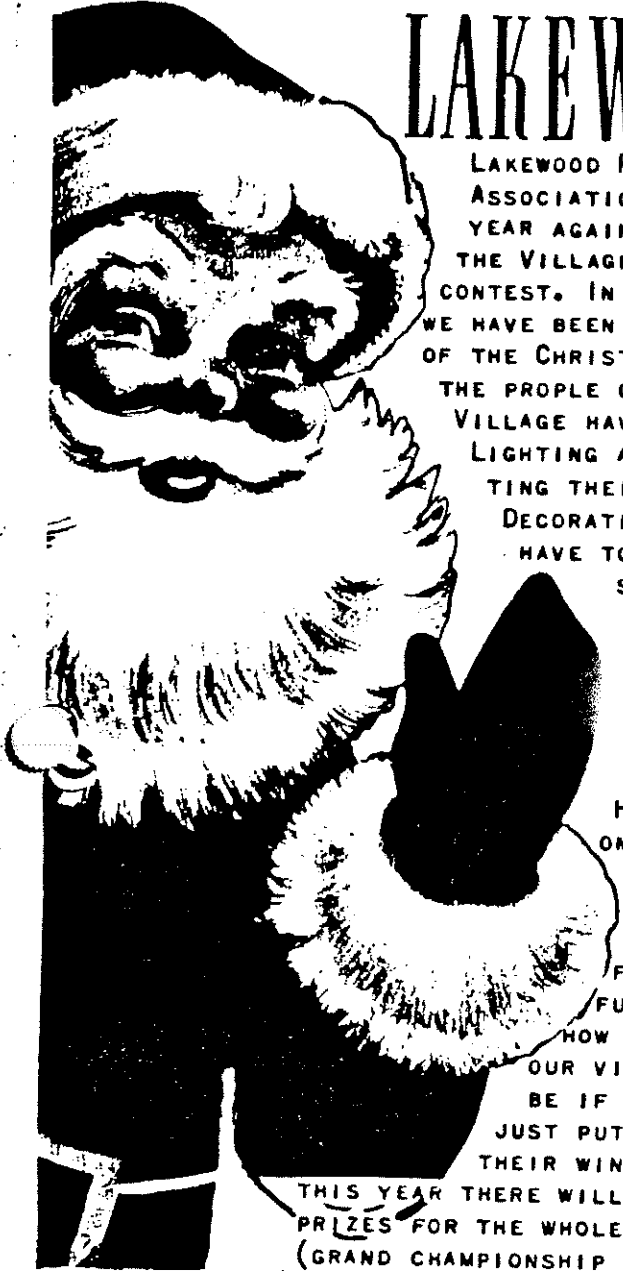
HAVE YOU PUT ON YOUR THINKING CAP YET. COME ON. IT MAKES

FARTY SALAD CHOP-CHOP

MAKES ABOUT 12 SERVINGS

- 1 PACKAGE (10 OZ.) FRESH SPINACH
- 1 MEDIUM-SIZE HEAD OF ICEBERG LETTUCE
- 1 MEDIUM-SIZE HEAD OF ROMAINE
- 1 LARGE AVOCADO, PARED AND SLICED
- 3 HARD-COOKED EGGS, SHELLED AND SLICED
- 1 SMALL CUCUMBER, SLICED
- 6 RADISHES, WASHED, TRIMED, AND SLICED
- PIQUANT DRESSING (RECIPE FOLLOWS)

1. CUT OUT ANY LARGE RIBS AND ALL STEMS FROM SPINACH; WASH ALL GREENS WELL; DRY.
- 2 CHOP GREENS, KEEPING EACH KIND SEPARATE. (YOU WILL HAVE ABOUT 12 CUPS) PLACE HALF THE LETTUCE IN A LARGE GLASS SALAD BOWL, THEN ADD LAYERS OF ROMAINE, REMAINING LETTUCE, AND SPINACH.
3. ARRANGE AVOCADO, EGG, CUCUMBER, AND RADISH SLICES IN SEPARATE ROWS ON TOP; DRIZZLE A LITTLE DRESSING OVER AVOCADO TO KEEP BRIGHT COLOR. COVER BOWL WITH TRANSPARENT SARAN OR FOIL; CHILL. (THIS MUCH CAN BE DONE 3 TO 4 HOURS AHEAD, IF YOU WISH.) JUST BEFORE SERVING, POUR DRESSING OVER, BUT DO NOT TOSS.

PIQUANT DRESSING-- COMBINE $\frac{2}{3}$ CUP SALAD OIL, $\frac{1}{3}$ CUP WINE VINEGAR OR CIDER VINEGAR, 2 TEASPOON SUGAR, 1 TEASPOON SALT, 1 TEASPOON DRY MUSTARD, AND $\frac{1}{2}$ TEASPOON WORCESTER-SHIRE SAUCE IN JAR WITH TIGHT LID, SHAKE WELL JUST BEFORE SERVING. MAKES 1 CUP.

SCHOOL BOARD

BAYSIDE AND FAIRWOOD ADDITIONS

AT THE NOVEMBER 15TH MEETING OF THE SUNNYVALE SCHOOL BOARD, THE TRUSTEES MADE FORMAL APPLICATION TO THE STATE FOR FUNDS TO CONTINUE IT'S BUILDING PROGRAM. THE APPLICATION, WHICH INCLUDES A SIX CLASSROOM WING AT BAYSIDE BUDGETED AT \$168,000, AND TWO PORTABLES AT FAIRWOOD, HAS BEEN TENTATIVELY APPROVED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENTS OF EDUCATION AND FINANCE. THE ADDITIONS SHOULD BE READY FOR OCCUPANCY BY SEPTEMBER 1963.

IT IS INTERESTING TO NOTE THAT THIS WILL BE THE 8TH AND 9TH PORTABLES TO BE "TEMPORARILY" LOCATED AT FAIRWOOD.

VOTE OF CONFIDENCE

ON NOVEMBER 14TH, THE SANTA CLARA TRAF WAYS COMMITTEE VOTED UNANIMOUSLY TO KEEP LAKEWOOD AND BRIDGEWOOD OPEN TO RIGHT TUR ONTO LAWRENCE STATION, AS RECOMMENDED BY SUNNYVALE CITY COUNCIL. THIS WILLINGNESS TAKE ANOTHER LOOK BASED UPON NEW INFORMAT SPEAKS WELL OF BOTH ORGANIZATIONS. THE FIN DECISION WILL REST WITH THE COUNTY BOARD (SUPERVISORS. THE LAWRENCE STATION ROAD COMMITTE (L.V.R.A.) WILL REMAIN INTACT PER ING FINAL OUTCOME.

LAKWOOD VOTERS SET RECORD

THE RESIDENTS OF LAKEWOOD VILLAGE TURN OUT IN RECORD NUMBERS AT THE NOVEMBER GENERAL ELECTION. VOTING WAS SLOW DURING THE EARLY PART OF THE DAY, BUT PICKED UP TO THE POINT THAT THE LINES OF WAITING VOTERS APPEARED AT MOST VOTING PRECINCTS IN THE FADING HOURS.

RECORDS OF THE VOTES COUNTS INDICATED THAT PRACTICALLY ALL OF THE CANDIDATES ELECTED RECEIVED THE MAJORITY OF VOTES IN LAKEWOOD. MORE THAN 1200 VOTES WERE CAST IN LAKEWOOD VILLAGE. THE VOTERS ARE TO BE COMPLEMENTED FOR THEIR INTEREST IN THEIR GOVERNMENT AND LOCAL ISSUES. MUCH CREDIT IS DUE TO THE INTERESTED VOLUNTEERS WHO WENT FROM DOOR TO DOOR GETTING OUT THE VOTERS.

VILLAGERS ROSE TO THE CRY FOR HELP AND WERE VERY INSTRUMENTAL IN HELPING TO DEFEAT THE COUNTY WATER BOND ISSUE, THE WATER BOND FAILED TO PASS BY APPROXIMATELY 6500 VOTES. LAKEWOOD VOTERS REJECTED THE ISSUE TO THE EXTENT THAT THEY NEEDED APPROXIMATELY 700 "YES" VOTES FROM OTHER AREAS TO OFFSET THEIR LOSS IN LAKEWOOD. THE VOTERS OF LAKEWOOD CAN TAKE CREDIT FOR 1/10 OF THE 6500 VOTES BY WHICH THE BONDS WERE DEFEATED.

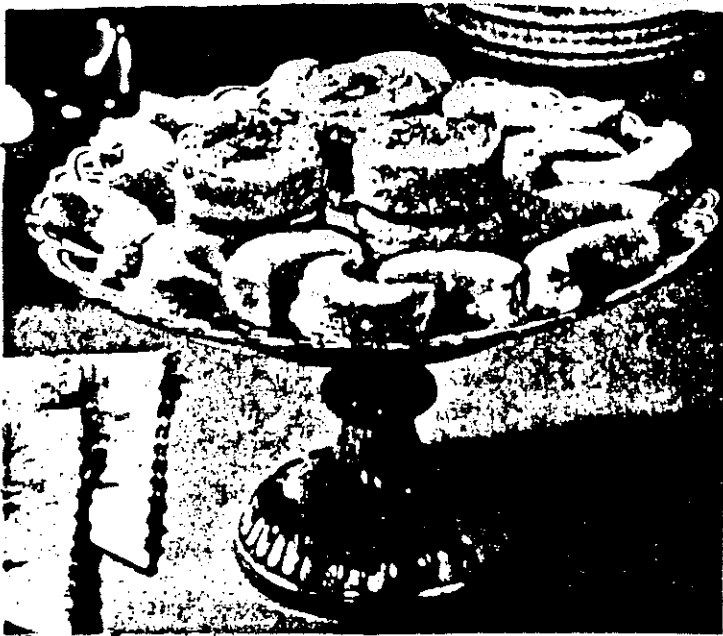

MOON-BEAMS

- | | |
|-----------------------------------|--------------------------|
| 1 cup (½ lb.) butter or margarine | 2 cups sifted cake flour |
| 1 cup sugar | ¼ teaspoon baking powder |
| 1 teaspoon grated lemon rind | ¼ teaspoon salt |
| 1 cup whole eggs (4 or 5) | Confectioners' sugar |

M. Cream butter or margarine and sugar thoroughly. Add lemon rind. Continue beating while adding eggs one at a time. Sift together the flour, baking powder and salt. Add to creamed mixture beating to blend thoroughly, about 1 minute. Pour into greased and floured 10x15-inch jelly roll pan. Bake in preheated slow (325° F.) oven for 30 minutes. Turn out of pan immediately on cake rack and while still hot cut into four equal lengthwise strips. Using a donut cutter cut strips into half moon shapes. Sift confectioners' sugar over top. Makes approximately 4 dozen First-Quarter Moon-Beams.

To make Full Moon-Beams cut rounds with biscuit cutter and frost with Lemon Cream Icing.

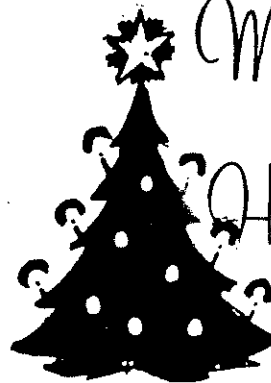

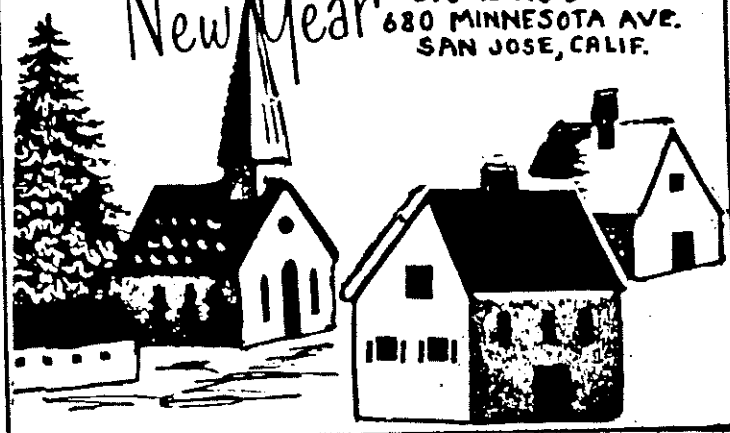

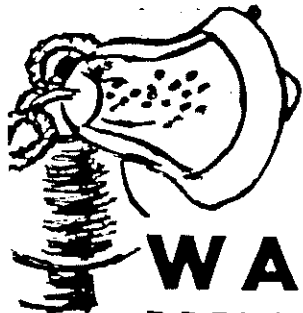
