



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

MANY RESIDENTS OF THE VILLAGE WILL BE HOUND-ED BY ALL KINDS OF SALES PEOPLE THIS SUMMER TRYING TO SELL MAGAZINES, NEWSPAPERS, BOOKS, PERIODICALS, PICTURES, INSURANCE AND BUILDING AND LOAN STOCKS AS WELL AS MANY OTHER ITEMS. MOST OF THE COMPANIES WILL EMPLOY SCHOOL CHILDREN TO SELL THEM.

THE CITY ORDINANCE SPECIFICALLY PROHIBITS THESE SALES PEOPLE FROM CALLING ON OR ENTERING UPON THE PRIVATE RESIDENCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF SELLING TO THE OCCUPANTS UNLESS INVITED TO DO SO BY THE OCCUPANTS. RESIDENTS THAT ARE BEING BOTHERED BY THESE SALES PEOPLE MAY ASK THEM TO PRODUCE A PERMIT WHICH THEY REQUIRED TO HAVE ON THEIR PERSON, AND IF FAIL TO PRODUCE A PERMIT ISSUED BY THE SAFETY DEPARTMENT, SHOULD CALL THE POLICE AND NOTIFY THEM OF THE FACT. THIS ACTION IS FOR THE BENEFIT OF ALL RESIDENTS.

MR. DICK MILKOVICH, PARKS AND RECREATION DIRECTOR FOR THE CITY OF SUNNYVALE WILL BE THE GUEST SPEAKER AT THE JULY MEETING. ALL RESIDENTS WHO ARE INTERESTED IN THE NEW LAKEWOOD PARK SHOULD ATTEND THIS MEETING. MR MILKOVICH WILL SHOW PICTURES OF THE PARK AND PLANS OF THE AREA WHICH WILL BE MOST WELCOME, GREATLY APPRECIATED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE VIL- LAGE. IN CIRCULATION THROUGHOUT THE AREA, MANY OF THE RESIDENTS WHO ARE MAKING THE COLLECT- ION FOR THE PARK FUND HAVE BEEN QUESTIONED ABOUT THE SO-CALLED SWIM CLUB THAT WAS BEING ORGANIZED IN THE AREA A FEW YEARS AGO. MANY RESIDENTS ARE OF THE OPINION THE RESIDENT'S ASSOCIATION WAS SPONSORING THE SWIM CLUB. THIS IS NOT TRUE AND TO CLEAR THE RECORD THE SWIM CLUB WAS A STRICTLY PRIVATE VENTURE, AND WAS NOT FINANCED BY THE ASSOCIATION IN ANY MANNER.

THE MEMBERS AT THE JUNE MEETING RECOMMEND- ED THAT THE CITY FATHERS BE CONTACTED AND AN ATTEMPT MADE TO GET CITY HALL KEPT OPEN ON SAT- URDAY MORNINGS. IT WAS THE FEELING OF THE MEMBERS THAT SINCE THIS IS A CITY WHERE PRACTICALLY EVERYBODY WORKS, THAT TO GET A

BUILDING PERMIT OR TRANSACT ANY OTHER BUSIN- ESS WITH THE CITY IT IS NORMALLY NECESSARY TO TAKE TIME OFF FROM THE JOB TO TRANSACT THIS BUSINESS AT MUCH EXPENSE TO THE PEOPLE AND INCONVENIENCE AS WELL. THEY FELT THAT MOST PEOPLE ARE IN TOWN DOING THEIR SHOPPING AND ATTENDING TO OTHER AFFAIRS AND THE CITY PERSONNEL ARE SERVANTS OF THE PEOPLE AND SH- OULD THEREBY RENDER THE BEST POSSIBLE SERVICE.

THE ASSOCIATION FURTHER WENT ON RECORD AS OPPOSING THE ZONING OF 33 HUNDRED ACRES OF LAND EAST OF CALABASSES CREEK BY THE COUNTY ZONING COMMISSION. THIS LAND IS TO BE ANNEXED TO THE CITY OF SANTA CLARA BY THE AGREEMENT WITH NEIGHBORING CITIES AND AS A RESULT THE ZONING SHOULD BE DONE BY THE CITY OF SANTA CLARA.
