L.V.R.A. Supports Flood Control Bonds

MEMBERS AND GUESTS HEARD A MOST INTERESTING LECTURE AT THE SEPTEMBER GENERAL MEETING, ON FLOOD CONTROL IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY AND THE CITY OF SUNNYVALE.

THE SPEAKING DELIGATION WAS HEADED BY MR. WILLIAM T. HOPKINS, ASSISTANT CITY MGR. OF SUNNYVALE. THE SPEAKERS POINTED OUT THAT A BETTER FLOOD CONTROL IS A MUST FOR THIS IMMEDIATE AREA. SOME OF THE POINTS BROUGHT OUT WERE THAT WITH THE INCREASE OF THE BUILDING PACE IN SUNNYVALE WE GET MUCH MORE RUN-OFF OF RAIN-WATER EACH YEAR. THEY POINTED OUT AT THE CALABASSES CREEK ON THE EAST SIDE OF LAKEWOOD VILLAGE, IS FILLED TO CAPACITY FROM A NORMAL RAIN AND MORE FLOOD CHANNELS MUST BE BUILT.

IT WAS FURTHER POINTED OUT THAT FINANCING THE PROJECT WITH LONG TERM BONDS THAT THE PRESENT TAX CAN BE REDUCED IN THE FLOOD CONTROL ZONE.

AS A RESULT LOCAL RESIDENTS WOULD BENEFIT FROM THIS BOND MEASURE. WE LIVE IN A LOW AREA AND ARE THREATMED WITH FLOOD WATERS AND IN ADDITION HAVE A CHANCE FOR A REDUCTION IN TAXES AT THE SAME TIME, THE VOTE WAS UNANIMOUS IN SUPPORT OF THE PROGRAM.

WHEN COMPLETED IT WILL HAVE TENNIS COURTS, HAND BALL COURTS, BASKETBALL COURTS, HORSE SHOE PITS, BICYCLE RACE TRACK, A PICNIC AREA FOR BOTH LARGE AND SMALL GROUPS, A PLAY AREA FOR THE SMALL TOTS AS WELL AS AN AREA FOR THE

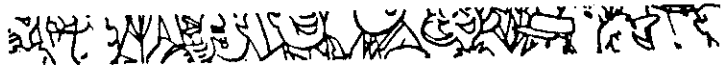

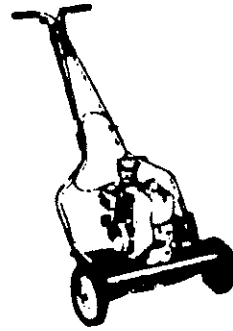

| 1 envelope gelatin | 1/4 cup hot lemon juice |
| 1/4 cup cold water | 1/2 cup sugar |
| 1/2 cup hot orange juice | 1 cup whipping cream |

1. Soften gelatin in water for 5 minutes.
2. Dissolve softened gelatin in hot fruit juices.
3. Add the sugar and stir.
4. Place about a half teaspoon of the gelatin mixture in the indentations in bottom of Crown mold. Then place a maraschino cherry in each indentation. Place the mold in the refrigerator.
5. Chill the gelatin mixture until it is almost set — about consistency of honey — and then whip it in a chilled bowl with a wire whip or electric beater until it is light as whipped cream.
6. Fold whipped gelatin into the whipped cream and pour on top of cherries in mold. Chill.
7. Unmold and serve plain or with a thin cold custard sauce. Serves 4 to 6.

Community Fund Drives Start Soon; \$11.4 Million Needed in Bay Area

Hundreds of youngsters like those in photo at right are happy and well cared for at the six United Bay Area Crusade day nurseries and similar institutions throughout California. They are children who need a part-time home away from home. Their mothers must work or are too ill to care for them.

They are children like Debbie Silva, 7, who lives at 2247 Foothill Boulevard, Oakland. Last year, Debbie's mother had to go to the hospital because of tuberculosis. Her father is an iron worker. And with all Mrs. Silva's medical bills, the family couldn't afford household help to care for Debbie. So the father called on the United Crusade, and St. Vincent's Day Home opened its doors to Debbie. Altogether last year, United Crusade day homes gave more than 142,000 days of care to children like Debbie.

The United Bay Area Crusade, which this year has



a quota of \$11,407,000, is typical of scores of other community fund drives being held during the next several weeks.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS



HINTS FOR REMOVING STAINS:
1. FOR CHEWING GUM: If the material will not water spot, rub the gum stain with ice. Then scrape and rub the hardened gum out of the cloth. This method is particularly good for rugs and other heavy materials.
2. FRUITS AND BERRIES:

Treat fruit and berry stains immediately, if possible. They are hard to remove after they are dry. Boiling water (if it does not harm the cloth) or sometimes even warm water will remove most fruit stains.

PRESIDENT'S CORNER

REPRESENTATIVES OF THE LAKEWOOD RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION RECENTLY JOINED WITH LAND OWNERS, SOME LOCAL RESIDENTS AND THE CITY OF SANTA CLARA IN OPPOSING THE RE-ZONING OF SOME 3,300 ACRES OF LAND ADJOINING LAKEWOOD VILLAGE. THE LAND IS EAST OF THE VILLAGE AND NORTH OF BAYSHORE, AND IS PRESENTLY IN THE COUNTY. THE CITY OF SANTA CLARA PLANS TO ANNEX THE LAND AND HAS AN AGREEMENT WITH NEIGHBORING CITIES THAT THE LAND IS TO BECOME A PART OF THAT CITY.

THE AREA IS IN THE JEFFERSON SCHOOL DISTRICT AND HAD BEEN SET ASIDE FOR INDUSTRIAL USE. SOME OF THE REASONS FOR THE OPPOSITION WAS THAT THE LAND LAYS LOWER THAN LAKEWOOD VILLAGE AND WOULD BE IN DANGER OF FLOODING. THE SHOULD BE IN THE CITY OF SANTA CLARA DEVELOPED IN ORDER TO HAVE BETTER CONTROL OF THE QUALITY OF THE BUILDINGS. THE CITY HAS INSTALLED LARGE SANITARY SEWERS IN THE AREA FOR INDUSTRIAL USE. THE JEFFERSON SCHOOL DISTRICT IS IN BAD FINANCIAL CONDITION AND NEEDS INDUSTRY TO HELP WITH THE TAX BURDEN.

THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS VOTED TO APPROVE THE ZONING OF ONE HALF OF THE LAND FOR HOMES AND THE OTHER HALF FOR INDUSTRY.

IN OTHER ZONING ACTION THE SUNNYVALE CITY COUNCIL APPROVED A MOBILE HOME PARK ON FAIROAKS AVENUE WEST OF THE VILLAGE, AND IN BACK OF GREENLAKE DRIVE. THE ASSOCIATION OBJECTED TO THIS ZONING BUT THE DEVELOPERS ASSURED THE COUNCIL THAT THE PARK WOULD BE OF BEAUTIFUL DESIGN AND BEAUTIFULLY LANDSCAPED AND WOULD NOT HURT THE VILLAGE PROPERTY VALUES. THE COUNCIL WAS FURTHER ASSURED THAT THE SCHOOLS WOULD NOT BE OVERLOADED AS THE PARK IS FOR COUPLES ONLY AND OLDER PEOPLE. THE DEVELOPERS PROMISED THE COUNCIL AND VILLAGERS THAT NO ROADS WOULD BE BUILT THROUGH FROM FAIROAKS TO THE VILLAGE AND THEREBY WOULD NOT CAUSE A TRAFFIC PROBLEM TO THE VILLAGE.

VERY INTERESTING THINGS ARE HAPPENING IN THE ASSOCIATION AND THE ASSOCIATION NEEDS MO-

IT'S THE LAW

CALIFORNIA WILL HAVE SOME NEW LAWS BEGINNING FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 27TH, I HAVE LISTED A FEW OF THEM BELOW:

MAKE IT A MISDEMEANOR TO ABANDON A DOMESTICATED DOG OR CAT.

INCREASE REGULATION OF TELEVISION AND RADIO REPAIRMEN.

MAKE IT A MISDEMEANOR TO INTERFERE WITH DISCIPLINE IN SCHOOLS, OR ABUSE OR INSULT A TEACHER PERFORMING OFFICIAL DUTIES.

BAN TELEPHONE SALES OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES UNLESS THE CUSTOMER SHOWS PROOF OF AGE ON DELIVERY.

THE DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES HAS EXPLAINED IMPORTANT LAW CHANGES AFFECTING REGISTRATION OF CERTAIN TRUCKS AND TRAILERS. ONE AFFECTS CAMPERS, WHICH HAVE BECOME POPULAR ON PICKUP TRUCKS. UNDER THE LAW, ALL CAMPERS WHICH ARE ATTACHED PERMANENTLY TO PICKUPS WILL BE CONSIDERED PART OF THE VEHICLE AND THE PICKUPS CAN BE REGISTERED AS PASSENGER CARS, HOWEVER, THE PICKUP WILL BE SUBJECT TO VEHICLE LICENSE FEES BASED ON THE ASSESSED VALUE OF THE CAMPER BODY, AS WELL AS THE TRUCK.

WHEN CAMPERS ARE ATTACHED ONLY TEMPORARILY TO THE PICKUPS, THE PICKUP WILL BE CLASSIFIED AS A COMMERCIAL VEHICLE, REQUIRING PAYMENT OF WEIGHT FEES BUT WITH NO EXTRA CHARGE FOR THE CAMPER.

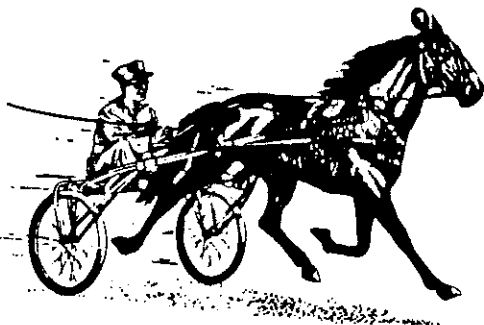

Some 5-Year Olds Due In First Grade Classes

A score of talented and "ma-
ture" five-year-olds will be en-
rolled in first grade classes
throughout the area later this
school year.

The State Board of Education
today adopted new regulations
permitting certain kindergarten-
age youngsters to make the jump.

The new regulation, which goes
into effect during the 1963-64
school year, requires that the
child score in the upper five per
cent of an intelligence test for his
age group.

The child also must have spent
sufficient time in kindergarten to
allow school officials to evaluate
whether he is sufficiently physi-
cally developed and social mature
to make the jump to first grade.

The new regulation implements
a law passed by the 1961 legisla-
ture. Under prior status, the child
could not move into the first
grade until he had reached the
age of five years, 9 months.

Jefferson Elementary School
District has already drawn up pre-
liminary plans for conforming
with the new regulation.

Trustees, when they meet Sept.
26, are expected to review ad-
ministrative recommendation
which, among other things, re-
commend that at least six weeks
be allowed for evaluation of poten-
tial five-year-old first graders.

Assist' Supt. Dennis Carmichael
estimates no more than 50 of the
1,500 kindergartens will be in-
volved in the change.

Sunnyvale Elementary School
District also is expected to pre-
sent administrative recommenda-
tions concerning the program to
the board of education soon.

Dr. Robert Muscio, assistant
superintendent for instruction, es-
timates that between 40 and 50 of
the 1,200 kindergarteners could
be effected by the new state reg-
ulation.

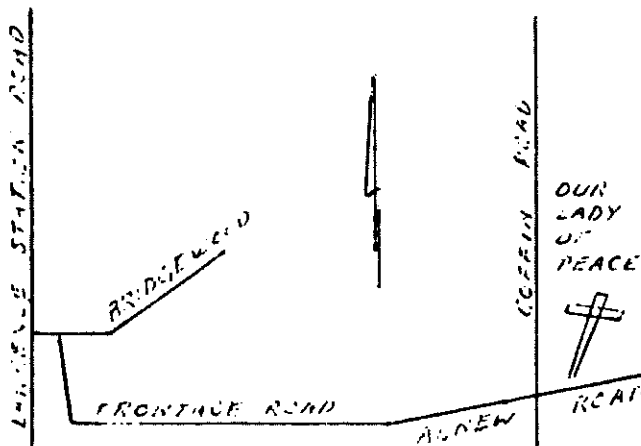
