Work Helps Lakewood Villagers Push Ahead

SUNNYVALE—A lean one-time Tennessee farmboy is showing how faith and toil can harvest rich rewards in Sunnyvale's backyard.

Richard B. (for nothing) Lofton is president of what he claims is the biggest residents association in Northern California—the Lakewood Village Residents Assn. which has more than 1,000 members.

He preaches work and more work for the 8,000 citizens of an area once considered on the verge of blight but which posted impressive achievements in the last year.

Lofton is a refreshing change from the typical wordy civic booster, however.

He has proven by his own experience that "paint up, fix up" pays off. He is full of practical advice and much more important, help.

Friends said that when he arrived here three years, eight months ago he had around \$3,000. Today, he owns more than a dozen homes in the village and holds assets well over \$100,000.

Success came to him because he followed this formula: Buy run down homes and fix them up. Rent to good tenants and encourage them to continue the improvements. If necessary, give them the paint. Keep your money circulating. Buy more property as soon as you can. And be ready to help your neighbor, particularly the newcomers and the young.

Lofton already has terminated a half dozen careers in the Air Force. Someday he may retire to a farm and raise cattle. Meanwhile, he says: "There is money to be made here. And a job to be done. Maybe I'm just too much of an optimist, but I feel sure this village can't go anywhere but up."

A meticulous organizer with the savvy of a top sergeant (which he was) Lofton is frequently called on for counsel. "I don't spend much time for myself," he says matter-of-factly. "There are many people who are referred to me, newcomers to Moffett Field and Lockheed. I try to find them suitable housing and help them get started." He has a garage full of mattresses and chairs which he loans.

"I find the majority of our people—particularly the young couples—are very poor financial managers." He tries to get them on the road to solvency. "The key to the whole situation is: 'too many time payments.' Credit is easy to get, a awful hard to pay back. Interest rates are terrifically high. People don't plan on emergencies when they figure up their monthly payments. They don't leave a reserve to tide them over and that's when they get in trouble."

Lofton also thinks most people today "have no sales resistance. I try to give them that. They think they owe too much to themselves," he said.

This 44-year-old counselor-philosopher was born and raised in Bethel Springs, 80 miles east of Memphis on his family's cotton farm. "We had plenty to eat but no money to spend," he recalls.

"We bought nothing in the store except matches, kerosene, salt and sugar. The rest we produced ourselves." He remembers he sometimes worked for 50 cents a day, never saw a Ku Klux Klanner.

He finished the eighth grade (later he took high school and college work in the Air Force), learned how to operate bulldozers and drag line equipment working on government dam projects.

In 1939 he enlisted in the then Army Air Corps. It was a "wonderful" change for the farmboy who began to see the world. He was a plane mechanic. "In that day and age before the technical schools it was patch 'em up about any way to keep them flying," he said. "You had to be good with safety wire and dope and fabric."

"Amazingly enough, there weren't a lot of accidents. The planes were much slower, the pilots could land anyplace. We called them cow pasture pilots."

He traveled to Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Nevada, Nebraska, England, Germany and back home before retiring in 1959 at Reno.

During World War II, he was an engineer-gunner up front in the B-17 Flying Fortress and was never shot down.

On recruiting duty from 1945 to 1951 he met his wife Margaret. The couple has a son, Randall, 12. He also has two married children by a first marriage.

In 1951 and 1952 Lofton was a special agent for the Air Force's investigations office in Europe and he also served in

counter intelligence. He doesn't talk much about these days except to remark that he admires Scotland Yard.

He served as civil defense advisor to southwest Nebraska and northwest Kansas in 1956-59, was inducted as an honorary admiral in the Nebraska Navy.

Visiting relatives here, he decided "the climate and area was excellent" for "retirement." He moved to 75 Lakebird Dr. and into the vortex of Village life.

Since Lofton had been a hunter, fisherman, pilot with his own plane, cabin cruiser and power boat skipper, bowler, golfer, stock car racer, and ham radio operator, he figured he could cope with Sunnyvale.

"You know why we like it here? We feel at home in the village," he says. "There is an atmosphere of friendliness here. People help each other and make newcomers feel welcome."

Lofton says the long term hostility of villagers to "downtown" Sunnyvale appears to be waning. "We are very grateful for our new fire station and park and our three fine schools," he insists.

"I tell my friends: You have everything to gain by improving your property. Anytime it goes up in value, you have improved your financial status."

The impetus to upgrade the village is catching but could be arrested if the city surrounds the neighborhood with trailer parks and other "unfavorable" land uses, Lofton argues. This is the village's main fight now. He says he would rather see apartments use vacant land.

Lofton says most people can enjoy the success he's found. "I feel any man that takes the initiative and works, thinks, and plans can make it. I find the main trouble with people is they cannot think positively and they lack confidence."

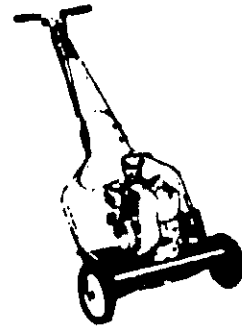


**PRESIDENT'S

BAYSIDE LIBRARY WAS OPEN TO THE CHILDREN OF BOTH LAKEWOOD AND BAYSIDE SCHOOLS DURING THE MONTHS OF JUNE, JULY AND AUGUST. MRS. BRENNER NOT ONLY WORKED WITH HER AIDES, BUT IT WAS THE UNSELFISH GIVING OF HER TIME THAT MADE THE LIBRARY PROGRAM ONE WHICH THE CHILDREN ENJOYED.

NOT ONLY DID CHILDREN BORROW BOOKS, THEY PARTICIPATED IN SUCH PROGRAMS AS THE READING HOUR, SLIDE SHOWS, DISPLAYS AND SING-ALONGS. THESE WERE PROGRAMS WHICH MADE READING AND, MORE IMPORTANT, LIBRARY USAGE VALUABLE TO THE CHILDREN.

MRS. BRENNER, IN ADDITION TO THIS LIBRARY PROGRAM, CARED FOR HER HOME AND THREE SONS. AS ONE OF THE MANY PERSONS WHO SAY "I DO NOT HAVE TIME" MRS. BRENNER IS AN EXAMPLE OF A BUSY PERSON WHO MADE THE TIME TO GIVE TO HER CHILDREN AND YOUNGERS.

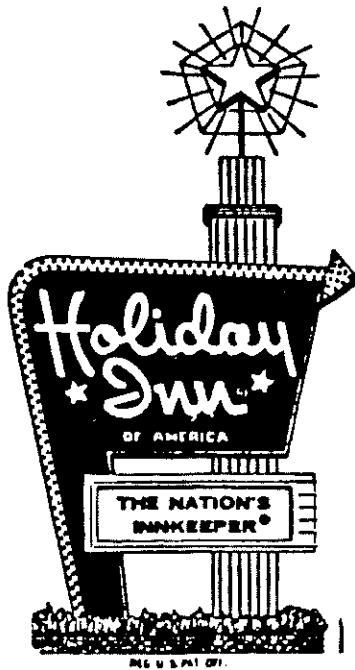
