SANTA TO VISIT VILLAGE

PARADE

SANTA IS COMING FOR HIS ANNUAL VISIT TO THE CHILDREN OF THE VILLAGE ON SUNDAY DEC. 15TH IF RAIN THEN THE NEXT SUNDAY, STARTING AT 10:00 A.M. THE SOUND OF CHRISTMAS MUSIC WILL TELL YOU SANTA IS ON YOUR STREET, HIS ELVES WILL BE WALKING ON THE SIDEWALK TO HAND OUT THE CANDY TO THE KIDDIES. THIS YEAR SANTA WILL START HIS RIDE ON THE SHOPPING CENTER SIDE OF THE VILLAGE.

CHRISTMAS FLOAT

SANTA'S WORKSHOP IS THE THEME WE HAVE SELECTED FOR THE FLOAT THAT THE L.V.R.A. WILL ENTER IN THE JUNIOR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE CHRISTMAS PARADE THROUGH DOWNTOWN SUNNYVALE. THE PARADE WILL BE HELD ON SATURDAY, DECEMBER 7TH, UNLESS IT RAINS AND THEN WILL BE HELD ON THE FOLLOWING SATURDAY. THE FLOAT WILL ALSO BE USED FOR SANTA'S PARADE THROUGH THE VILLAGE ON DECEMBER 15TH.

THE DIMENSIONS OF THE BASE OF THE FLOAT ARE 8' X 12' WITH A HOUSE AT ONE END. THE COLOR SCHEME OF THE FLOAT IS RED AND WHITE & GREEN PREDOMINATELY. THERE WILL BE 4 CHILDREN DRESSED IN COSTUMES REPRESENTING TOYS. THERE WILL BE 2 TIN SOLDIERS STANDING AT THE DOOR OF THE WORKSHOP, A BALLERINA AND A SMALL CHILD AS A JACK-IN-THE-BOX WHO WOULD JUMP UP FROM TIME TO TIME. MRS. SANTA (LIZ SIMOLA) HAS CONSENTED TO RIDE ON THE FLOAT TO SUPERVISE THE CHILDREN.

THE FLOAT IS GOING TO BE MOUNTED ON A LOG TRAILER SO THAT IT WILL BE EASILY SEEN BY THE CHILDREN WHO WILL BE LINING THE SIDE OF THE STREETS.

A FULL REPORT WILL BE MADE IN THE NEXT EDITION OF THE VILLAGER.

FELLOW VILLAGERS- WE WERE NOT ABLE TO HAVE THE SUNNYVALE SCHOOL REPRESENTATIVES, AT OUR NOV. 4TH MEETING BECAUSE THEY HAD PREVIOUS ENGAGEMENTS. HOWEVER A MEETING WAS HELD AT THE LAKEWOOD SCHOOL NOV. 5TH. ATTENDANCE WAS NOT AS GOOD AS DESIRED, BUT WAS AS GOOD AS COULD BE EXPECTED, WITH THE SHORT NOTICE.

THE MEETING STARTED WITH A VERY WELL PLANNED EXPLANATION OF THE SCHOOL HOUSING PROB-

LEM CURRENTLY BEING FACED IN SUNNYVALE. BRIEFLY, THERE IS A LARGE SUBDIVISION BEING STARTED SOUTH OF 1L CAMINO FOR WHICH THERE IS NO SCHOOL BUILDING. THE SCHOOL TO BE BUILT THERE IS CUMBERLAND & IT IS BEING BUILT WITH STATE FUNDS ALLOCATED ON A BASIS OF THE PROJECTED ENROLLMENT OF ALL THE SUNNYVALE SCHOOL THERE ARE ONLY SUFFICIENT FUNDS AVAILABLE THIS YEAR FOR ONE STRUCTURE, SO THE NUMBER TWO PRIORITY, THE LONG PROMISED ALL-PURPOSE ROOM AT LAKEWOOD, WILL ONCE AGAIN BE FORGOTTEN. THE SCHOOL BOARD WAS ASKED WHY THEY WERE BUILDING FOR POTENTIAL RESIDENTS AT THE EXPENSE OF EXISTING RESIDENTS IN AN ESTABLISHED NEIGHBORHOOD & THEY REPLIED THAT THEY WERE PLANNING AHEAD. THEY ADMITTED THAT THEY HAD NOT INVESTIGATED WHY FAMILIES WITH 7TH & 8TH GRADE CHILDREN WERE LEAVING THE VILLAGE, BUT SEEMED DISINTERESTED IN A SURVEY CONDUCTED BY THE SECRETARY OF LVRA ON THE SUBJECT.

THEY STATED THAT A JR. HIGH ADDITION IS PLANNED FOR LAKEWOOD SCHOOL - SOMEDAY, BUT NOT SOON AS EXISTING FACILITIES ARE HOPED TO BE ADEQUATE.

THE SCHOOL BOARD COMMENDED THE VILLAGE FOR ITS STRONG SUPPORT OF PREVIOUS SCHOOL BONDS BUT ASKED IF A LARGER VOTE COULD BE TURNED OUT. SOME RESIDENTS AT THE MEETING OPENLY WONDERED IF THE CONTINUAL BYPASSING OF LAKEWOOD VILLAGE MIGHT NOT RESULT IN A LESS FAVORABLE ATTITUDE ON FUTURE ISSUES. THERE ARE ENOUGH OF US IN LAKEWOOD VILLAGE THAT A GOOD TURNOUT AT AN ELECTION COULD SWING AN ISSUE ONE WAY OR THE OTHER.

THE SCHOOL BOARD FIRMLY STATED THAT IT WOULD NOT PROMISE ANYTHING BECAUSE THEY RUN A

COMPLETE RE-EVALUATION OF THE DISTRICTS NEED EACH TIME BUILDING FUNDS ARE AVAILABLE. THEY CLEARLY STATED THAT NUMBER 2 PRIORITY ASSIGNED TO THE LAKEWOOD SCHOOL CORE WILL BE RE-CONSIDERED WHEN THE NUMBER 1 PRIORITY IS COMPLETED.

THE MANY PROBLEMS ASSOCIATED WITH OUR SCHOOL SITUATION WERE DISCUSSED, SUCH AS: (A) OVERCROWDING OF THE LAST BUS FROM MADRONE JR. HIGH, (THE ONE CARRYING THE STUDENTS WHO PARTICIPATE IN AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES); (B) THE SCHEDULE THE LAST BUS FOLLOWS; (C) THE CHILDREN AT LAKEWOOD HAVING THEIR LUNCHES BLOWN ABOUT THE WINDY SCHOOL YARD. THE SCHOOL BOARD STATED THAT IT IS EXPLORING THE POSSIBILITY OF PROVIDING HOT LUNCHES AT BAYSIDE SCHOOL FOR THE LAKEWOOD CHILDREN, BUT TRANSPORTATION IS A PROBLEM.

RESIDENTS OF LAKEWOOD VILLAGE WERE INVITED TO ATTEND THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE SCHOOL BOARD AND WE WERE ADVISED THAT WE NEED ONLY NOTIFY OUR PRINCIPLE IF WE WANT TO GET ON THE BOARDS AGENDA FOR FORMAL DISCUSSION.

ALL IN ALL, MEETING WAS VERY INFORMATIVE. THE SCHOOL BOARD LEFT NO DOUBT THAT THEY WOULD ALLOCATE FUNDS AS THEY SAW FIT, AND THEY WERE IMPRESSED WITH THE VILLAGERS WHO CAME ON SUCH SHORT NOTICE TO THEIR MEETING. THEY KNOW THAT WE ARE HERE, BUT THE JOB OF REMINDING THEM BELONGS TO THE WHOLE VILLAGE. IF WE WANT BETTER SCHOOLS FOR OUR CHILDREN, WE ARE GOING TO HAVE TO WORK FOR THEM; "THE SQUEEKING WHEELS GET THE GREASE!" LET THEM KNOW THAT FANCY SCHOOLS IN NEW AREAS SHOULD COME AFTER COMPLETED FACILITIES IN EXISTING, VOTING, AREAS.

HE FURTHER ADVISED ME OF CERTAIN OTHER STEPS THAT I MIGHT TAKE TO FURTHER PROTECT OUR CHILDREN FROM THE EX-

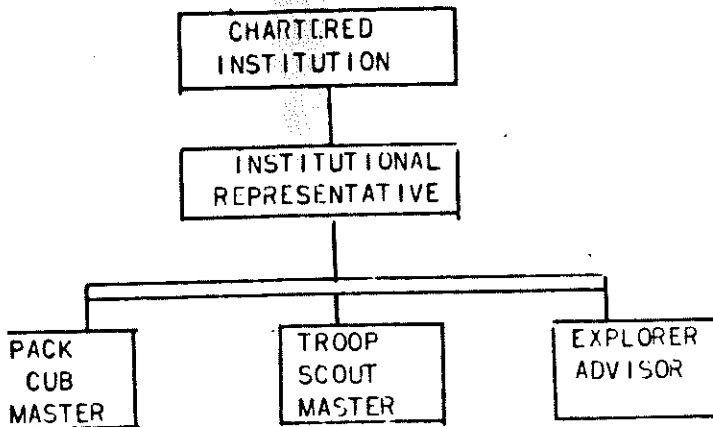
