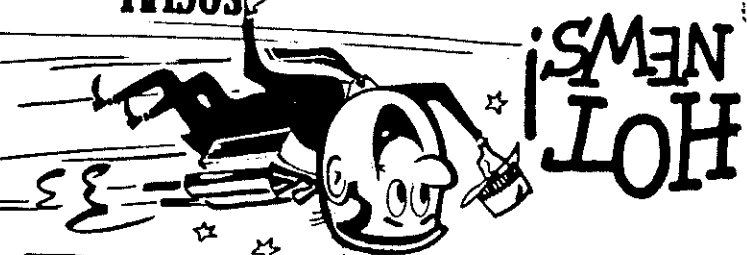

RED WHITE & GREEN

MAY IS THE TIME FOR PLANTING YOUR SUMMER GARDENS, IF YOU HAVEN'T ALREADY. I'VE GOTTEN ONE CROP OF RADISHES, AND MY LETTUCE IS ALMOST READY TO PICK. DON'T ATTEMPT TO RAISE ANYTHING THAT WILL REQUIRE A LOT OF HEAT: LIKE MELONS, AS THIS REGION HAS TOO MANY FOGGY MORNINGS.

CONTINUE YOUR SUMMER ANNUALS PLANTING (NURSERY-STARTED IS BEST), AND TREES IN CONTAINERS. SUMMER ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS STARTED FROM SEED IS BEST RAISED IN FLATS FOR BETTER WATERING, FEEDING, AND WEED CONTROL. ALSO, FLATS ARE MOBILE FOR WINTER

APHIS, SLUGS AND SNAILS ARE REALLY HEAVY THIS YEAR. EVERY YEAR THERE ARE NEWER AND STRONGER CONTROLS FOR THESE PESTS. ASK YOUR LOCAL GARDEN CENTER CLERK ABOUT THEM, AND READ THE INSTRUCTIONS COMPLETELY BEFORE USING. ALSO DESCRIBE THE PLANTS YOU ARE HAVING PROBLEMS WITH, AS SOME CONTROLS WILL DO WELL ON CERTAIN TYPES AND KILL OTHERS. START YOUR LAWN FERTILIZING AGAIN. 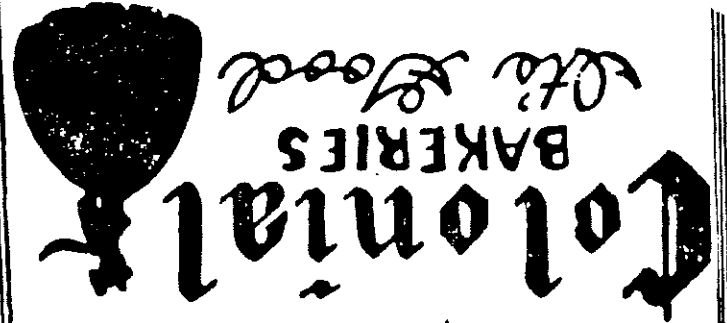
