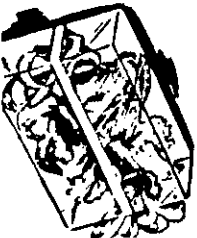
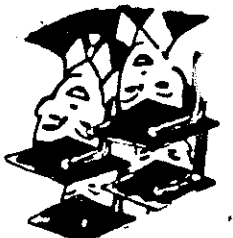

RED WHITE ? GREEN

SPECIAL: TREES FOR THIS AREA.

HAVE YOU AT ONE TIME OR ANOTHER, THOUGHT OF PLANTING A TREE FOR SHADE, WIND BREAK, OR PURE LANDSCAPING; BUT WHEN YOU WENT TO BUY IT FOUND THE SCOPE OF VARIETIES CONFUSING? HERE ARE SOME HELPFUL HINTS THAT WILL CONFUSE YOU MORE.

MONTEREY PINE:

WHEN YOUNG IT IS A SLENDER AND SPINDLY TREE; BUT AFTER 6-7 YRS. IT BRANCHES OUT. IT IS A FAST GROWING PINE; UP TO 60-90 FEET HIGH. IN SEVERE WIND CONDITIONS THE TOP FLATTENS OUT AWAY FROM THE WIND; GIVING THE TREE A CRAZY TOP-SIDED SHAPE; QUITE DIFFERENT FROM ITS EARLY PYRAMIDAL FORM.

PEPPERMINT TREE: (AGONIS FLEXUOSA);

LEPTOSPERMUM FLEXUOSUM): HOW SPREADING EVERGREEN; SLOW GROWING TO 25-35 FEET. THICK WEAVING BRANCHES; EUCALYPTUS LIKE FOLIAGE; SMALL WHITE FLOWERS IN JUNE. BARK HAS UNIFORM-LIKE COLOR AND FEEL. WORTH-WHILE.

SCREWED ACACIA (A. PRAVISSIMA)

LARGE FLOWER SPRAYS IN MARCH. GROWS TO 20 FOOT; SPREADS TO 15 FOOT. IT HAS DROOPING

MAGNOLIA:

THESE BEAUTIFUL TREES RESENT CROWDING AND MANY TYPES BECOME LARGE TREES. BEST TO PLANT THEM IN THE SPRING AS THEIR ROOTS ARE MORE ACTIVE THEN. BE VERY CAREFUL WITH THE ROOTS AS THEY WILL DECAY IF INJURED. DON'T LET SOIL AROUND TREE BECOME DRIED OUT. TOP GRESS TREE BASE WITH A GOOD MULCH (OLD LEAVES, COMPOST, OR WELL-ROTTED MANURE) LET YOUR WATERING SOAK THROUGH YOUR TOP DRESSING DOWN TO THE ROOTS. THESE FOUR TYPES OF MAGNOLIA ARE VERY SUITABLE FOR THIS AREA. ASK YOUR NURSERY MAN FOR MORE INFORMATION CONCERNING THESE TREES.

SILVER TREE (LEUCADENDRON)

GOLDEN ACACIA - GOLDEN WATTLE, (A. PYCNANTHUS) GROWS TO 25 FEET AND SPREADS TO 15 FEET. FOLIAGE IS LIME-GREEN AND SHAPED LIKE AN EUCALYPTUS. BLOOMS IN MARCH IN LOVELY LARGE GOLDEN BALLS IN GREAT PROFUSION. OLDER STEMS HAVE PLUM RED BLOSSOMS. THIS TREE NOT FOR MAY FEWER VICTIMS.

SILKY SILVERY-WHITE LEAVES UP TO 3-6 IN. IN DIAMETER, DENSELY COVER THE BRANCHES OF THIS EVERGREEN. NEEDS SOIL THAT DRAINS RAPIDLY. HATES CLAY SOIL, MANURE, AND LIME. BEST IN DECOMPOSED GRANITE. FAST GROWING, SHORT LIVED. EXCELLENT IN TUB AND BOXES FOR 3-4 YEARS.

MAGNOLIA:

THESE BEAUTIFUL TREES RESENT CROWDING AND MANY TYPES BECOME LARGE TREES. BEST TO PLANT THEM IN THE SPRING AS THEIR ROOTS ARE MORE ACTIVE THEN. 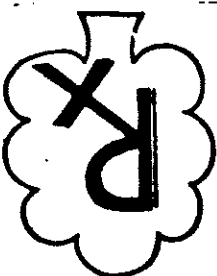

LILY MAGNOLIA (M. LILIFLORA) NEEDS PROTECTION FROM WIND.

DECIDUOUS TREE GROWING UP TO 12-15 FOOT HIGH. BLOOMS ARE WHITE INSIDE, PURPLISH OUTSIDE AND LASTS FROM SPRING THROUGH EARLY SUMMER.

SAUCER MAGNOLIA (M. SOULANGANA) HEIGHT UP TO 30 FEET. COLOR OF BLOOMS VARY FROM NEARLY WHITE, WHITE WITHIN AND SHADES OF ROSE TO PURPLE WITHOUT. SUITABLE FOR SMALL GARDENS BECAUSE OF SLOW GROWTH. IT WILL STAND LIGHT PRUNING.

STAR MAGNOLIA (M. STELLATA) WHITE STAR FLOWERS ON THIS DECIDUOUS TREE. NEXT TO M. SOULANGANA HYBRIDS, MOST WIDELY PLANTED.

TIME NOW FOR PLANTING YOUR SUMMER ANNALS FROM NURSERY PLANTS. YOUR PERENNIALS, BIENNIALS AND YOUR VEGETABLE GARDENS. PRUNE CLIMBING ROSES (ONCE A YEAR BLOOMERS) AFTER FLOWERING. FINISH PRUNING SPRING-FLOWERING SHRUBS.

FERTILIZE YOUR LAWNS, USING PLENTY OF WATER. BUILD CATCH BASINS AROUND TREE BASES TO HOLD A GOOD WATER SUPPLY. SAVES ON WATER BILLS.

GOVERNMENTS ARE PLEADING WITH ALL CITIZENS TO

HELP CLEAN UP AMERICA. MAN HAS SCARRIED THIS
