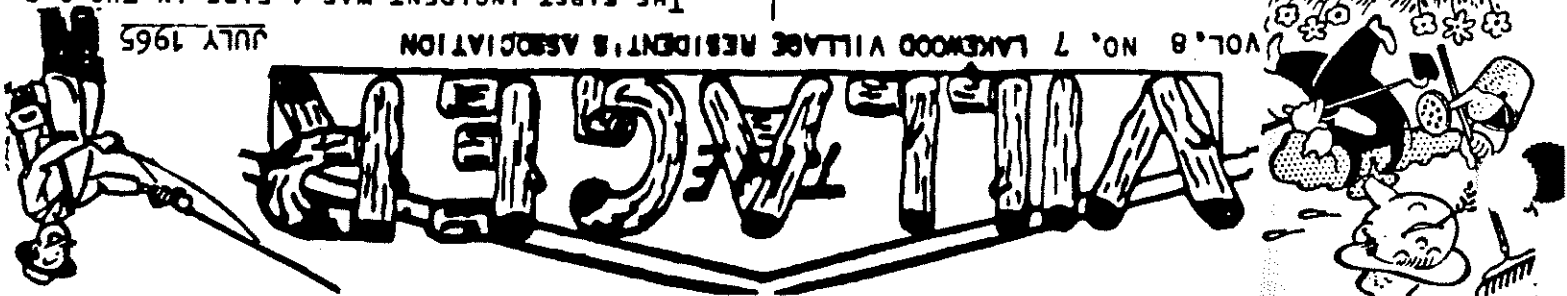

BOY SCOUT TRAINING PAYS OFF IN VILLAGE
IN TWO INSTANCES RECEIVED BY BOY SCOUTS
VILLAGE, THE TRAINING RECEIVED BY BOY SCOUTS
HAS PAID WELL.

THE FIRST INCIDENT WAS A FIRE IN THE GAR-
AGE OF MRS. ELINOR COOMES. CHILDREN PLAYING
WITH MATCHES SET FIRE TO THE INTERIOR OF THE
GARAGE. LARRY AND TOMMY KEY, FORMER MEMBERS OF
TROOPS 425 AND 437 WERE AMONG THE FIRST TO DIS-
COVER THE FIRE. USING TECHNIQUES TAUGHT THEM
IN SCOUTS THE BOYS "SURROUNDED THE FIRE" AND
WITH TWO HOSES EMPLOYED, HAD THE FIRE WELL
UNDER CONTROL BY THE TIME PUBLIC SAFETY EQUIP-
MENT ARRIVED. SINCE THERE WAS OIL AND GASOLINE
INVOLVED, THE FLAMES ROSE HIGHER THAN AN ADA-
CENT TELEPHONE POLE. NERVE, AS WELL AS KNOW-
LEDGE OF HOW TO FIGHT A FIRE WAS REQUIRED FOR
THESE TEENAGERS TO SUCCEED IN CONTAINING A
FIRE THAT COULD HAVE DESTROYED THE ENTIRE
HOME.
IN THE SECOND CASE FIRST AID TRAINING WAS
APPLIED BY DON YOUNG, OF TROOP 425. NINE YEAR
OLD RHONNA ELZINGRE SEVERED AN ARTERY IN HER
ARM WHEN SHE SLIPPED AND FELL AGAINST THE
WINDOW IN HER HOME. BECAUSE OF HIS FIRST AID
TRAINING, DON RECOGNIZED THE PULSATION OF
ARTERIAL BLEEDING AND TO AVOID POTENTIAL DAM-
AGE TO THE TISSUES, APPLIED DIRECT PRESSURE
INSTEAD OF THE "OLD FASHIONED" TECHNIQUE OF
USING A TOURNIQUET. ALTHOUGH HANDICAPPED BY
THE FACT THAT HE HAD A CAST ON HIS RIGHT HAND,
DON MAINTAINED THE PRESSURE WITH HIS LEFT HAND
UNTIL HE WAS RELIEVED BY THE ATTENDANT IN THE
AMBULANCE.
THESE ARE ONLY TWO CASES IN WHICH THE
TRAINING RECEIVED IN BOY SCOUTS HAS AVERTED
TRAGEDY. THESE ARE TWO INSTANCES IN WHICH
TEENAGERS HAVE SERVED WELL TO PROTECT LIFE
AND PROPERTY. WE CAN ALL FEEL A PRIDE IN OUR
YOUTH--WHO SERVE WITH NO THOUGHT OF PERSONAL
DANGER OR REWARD.

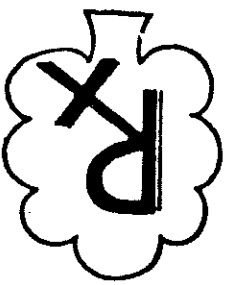

THE CITY OF SUNNYSVALE USES AS A GUIDE FOR ES-

TABLISHING MINIMUM HEALTH AND SAFETY REQUIRE-
MENTS FOR DWELLINGS WITHIN THE CITY, MODEL

CODES PUBLISHED AND REGULARLY REVISED BY NAT-
ALLY RECOGNIZED AUTHORITIES INCLUDING THE

UNIFORM BUILDING CODE" OF THE INTERNATIONAL
CONFERENCE OF BUILDING OFFICIALS, THE "UNIFORM

PLUMBING CODE" OF THE WESTERN PLUMBING OFFIC-
ALS ASSOCIATION AND THE "NATIONAL ELECTRIC

CODE" OF THE NATIONAL FIRE PROTECTION ASSOCIA-
TION WITH MODIFICATIONS AS ESTABLISHED BY THE

METHODS AS ARE DEEMED NECESSARY TO PROVIDE AD-
EQUATE INDIVIDUAL HEALTH AND SAFETY AND GENER-
AL PUBLIC WELFARE.
PERMITS
BEFORE BEGINNING ANY WORK, OBTAIN A PERMIT. A
PERMIT IS REQUIRED FROM THE BUILDING INSPECT-
ION DIVISION TO ERCT ANY BUILDING OR STRUCT-
URE, OR TO ADD TO, ALTER, REPAIR, MOVE OR DE-
MOLISH ANY BUILDING OR STRUCTURE IN THE CITY
OF SUNNYSVALE. SEPARATE PERMITS ARE REQUIRED
FOR BUILDING CONSTRUCTION, FOR PLUMBING, FOR
HEATING AND COMFORT COOLING, AND FOR ELECTRIC
WIRING AND ELECTRIC FIXTURES. OBTAIN BLANKS
AND FILE APPLICATION AT CITY HALL. SEVERE PEN-
ALTIES ARE PROVIDED FOR VIOLATION OF THE CITY
ORDINANCES.
SPECIAL OWNER PERMITS ARE ISSUED AUTHOR-
IZING A HOME OWNER TO DO HIS OWN WORK IN SIN-
GLE OR TWO-FAMILY RESIDENCES IN WHICH HE RE-
SIDING WORK IS DONE PERSONALLY BY THE OWNER OR
A MEMBER OF HIS IMMEDIATE FAMILY.
PERMITS BECOME NULL AND VOID IF WORK IS
NOT COMMENCED WITHIN 60 DAYS OR SHOULD THE
WORK BE ABANDONED FOR A PERIOD OF 120 DAYS.
THE BUILDING PERMIT FEE IS IN PROPORTION TO
THE REPLACEMENT VALUE OF THE BUILDING, INCLUD-
ING ALL MATERIAL OF EVERY DESCRIPTION AND ALL
LABOR OF ANY KIND PERFORMED IN MAKING THE IM-
PROVEMENT. THE PLUMBING PERMIT FEE IS BASED
ON THE NUMBER OF FIXTURES INSTALLED, THE ELEC-
TRICAL PERMIT FEE IS BASED ON THE NUMBER OF
OUTLETS, FIXTURES, ETC., AND THE HEATING AND
COMFORT COOLING PERMIT FEE IS BASED ON THE
TYPE AND SIZE OF APPLIANCE. CONT. ON PAGE 5

PLANS AND PLAN CHECKING FEE

TWO SETS OF PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS, AND A PLAN CHECKING FEE PAYABLE AT THE TIME PLANS ARE FILED, ARE REQUIRED WITH ALL DWELLINGS OF MORE THAN 600 SQUARE FEET FLOOR AREA, WITH DWELLINGS HAVING SPECIAL STRUCTURAL FEATURES AND WITH DWELLINGS BEING ALTERED. PLANS SHOULD BE BLUEPRINTED ON SUBSTANTIAL PAPER. THEY MUST CLEARLY SHOW THE MATERIAL, SIZE AND ARRANGEMENT OF THE FOUNDATION, FRAMING OF FLOORS, WALLS AND ROOF, SIZE OF WINDOWS, AND DETAILS OF SPECIAL FEATURES SUCH AS FIREPLACES, CHIMNEYS AND BALCONIES. TYPICAL PLAN THAT WOULD BE REQUIRED WOULD INCLUDE PLOT PLAN, FLOOR PLAN, ELEVATION, AND TYPICAL SECTION.

LEGAL DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY

IN YOUR APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT IT WILL BE NECESSARY TO GIVE A LEGAL DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPERTY. LOT, BLOCK, AND TRACT NUMBERS OR REFERENCE TO A RECORDED RECORD OF SURVEY MUST BE SHOWN ON APPLICATION.

PLOT PLAN

A PLOT PLAN SHOWING SIZE OF LOT AND ITS LOCATION WITH RESPECT TO THE NEAREST CROSS STREET MUST ACCOMPANY EVERY APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT. THE SIZE, LOCATION, OCCUPANCY, AND TYPE OF CONSTRUCTION OF THE PROPOSED BUILDING AND ANY EXISTING BUILDINGS ON THE LOT MUST BE SHOWN. THERE IS A LOT MORE TO THIS PAMPHLET, SO TAKE THE TIME TO OBTAIN ONE. YOU MAY BORROW YOUR UNIT REP'S COPY. L.V.R.A.





