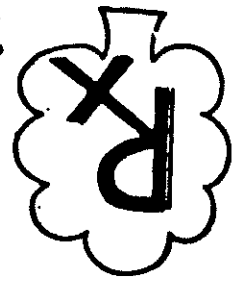

It's Wintertime! What?

That is what I said. Time to plant your fall and winter bulbs. Trees and shrubs from containers can also be planted this month, if you water them well.

Sow your winter vegetable crops. Cool season crops to keep in mind are: asparagus, rhubarb, beets, carrots, onions, broccoli and cabbage. These can be planted in late summer and produce well, if the rains aren't too early.

Divide your perennials now. If you have room in your beds, re-plant in new locations. If not, re-build your soil before replanting, as each year's growth cycle saps the greater portion of the soil's vitality. Prune your berry bushes after they have fruited. Continue cutting away all dead flower rods; especially rose "apricles", as they soak up and store a great deal of food that could go into making a longer bloom period. Mildew will soon be one of your garden's worst enemies. Cool, cloudy days are coming and heavy dew at night soon has leaves looking like they are coated with dust and curling up; blooms turning dark and sticky. There are several sprays and dusts on the market to combat mildew. They are helpful, but not sure bets. Special Winter & Spring Blooms: (I cannot cover all the flowers in this group in one issue; so I will try to cover perennials next month.) These flowers are to be sown in late summer or fall. Ask your nurserymen or read your labels for complete instruction on planting.

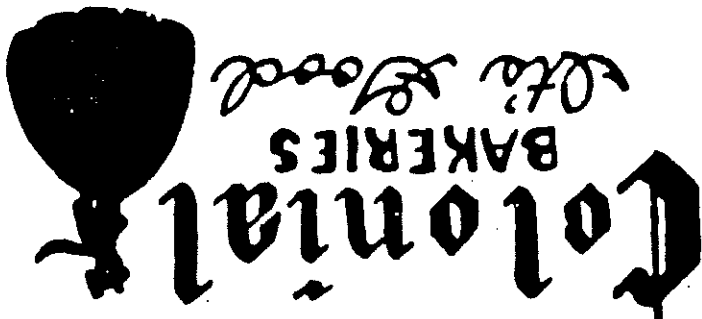

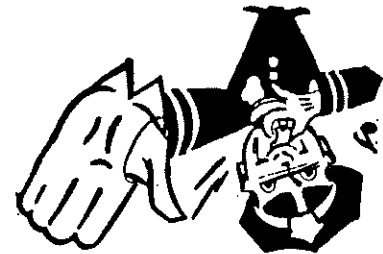

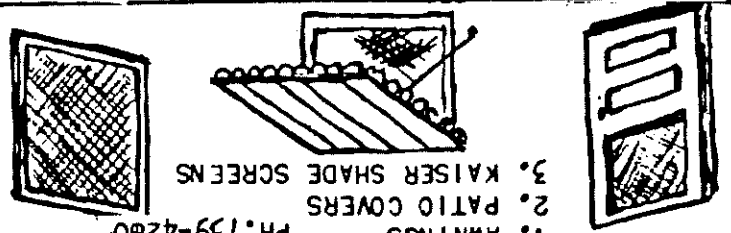
