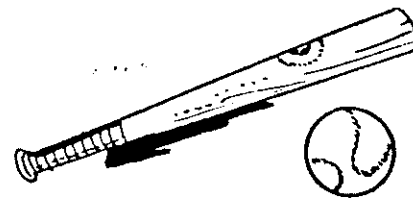

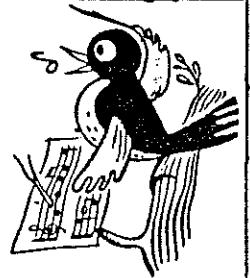

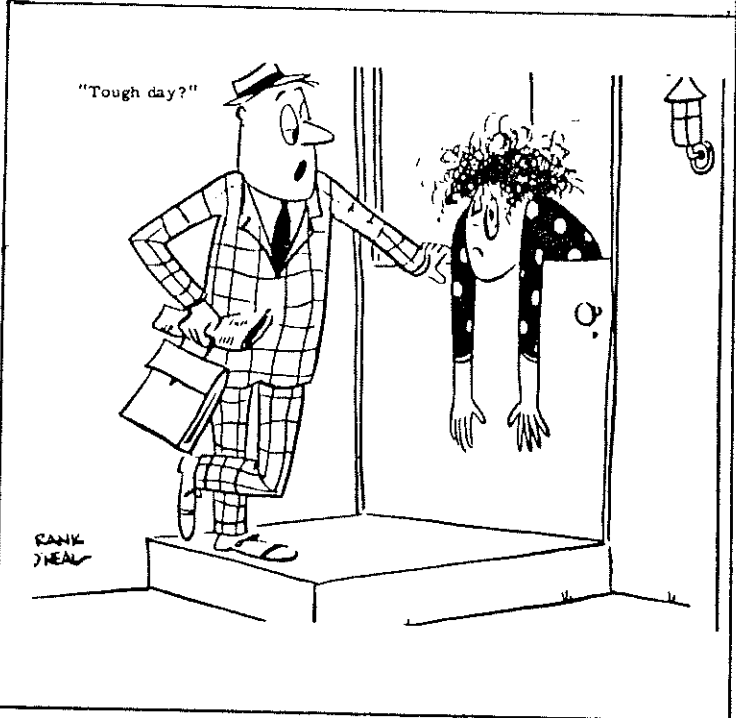

The girl selected by the judges to be Miss Lakewood Village will receive a wardrobe donated by the Lakewood Village Merchants' Association!!

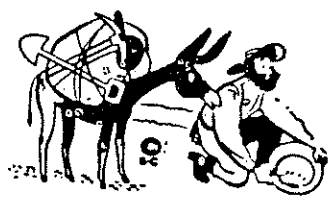
Two princesses will also be chosen, with prizes for both donated by the Lakewood Village Residents' Association.

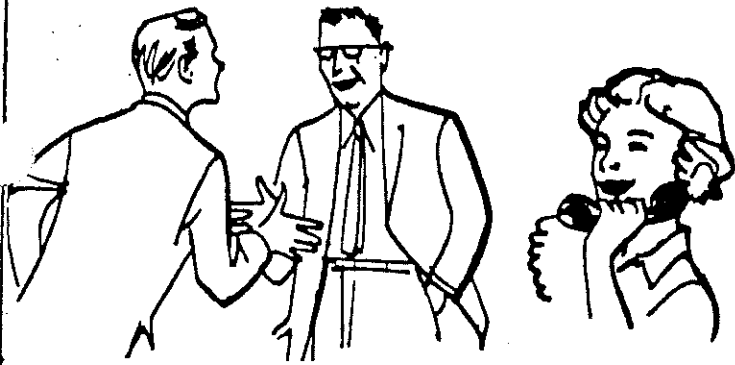
