FOURTH OF JULY SAFETY

CHIEF JESSUP OF THE SUNNYVALE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY ISSUED A WARNING TODAY REGARDING THE USE OF FIREWORKS DURING THE FORTHCOMING "INDEPENDENCE DAY" FIREWORKS SEASON.

SKYROCKETS, FIRECRACKERS, CHERRY BOMBS AND OTHER SIMILAR FIREWORKS ARE ILLEGAL IN SUNNYVALE.

EACH YEAR FIREWORKS CAUSE THOUSANDS OF INJURIES AND FIRES THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES. EVEN SO CALLED "SAFE AND SANE" SPARKLERS REACH TEMPERATURES OF UP TO 2000 DEGREES FARENHEIT AND HAVE IGNITED DRESSES AND OTHER CLOTHING, CAUSED COUNTLESS BURN INJURIES AND DWELLING FIRES.

CHIEF JESSUP OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RECOMMENDATIONS TO SUNNYVALE RESIDENTS FOR A SAFE 4TH OF JULY.

1. LIMITING YOUR "INDEPENDENCE DAY" PARTICIPATION TO ATTENDANCE OF ONE OF THE AREAS "PUBLIC FIREWORKS DISPLAYS". THE SUNNYVALE JUNIOR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE HAS SUCH A DISPLAY IN THE EVENING EACH YEAR.
2. IF YOU MUST HAVE FIREWORKS, USE ONLY THE LEGAL "SAFE AND SANE" TYPE.
3. DO NOT ALLOW SMALL CHILDREN TO USE THEM, OTHER CHILDREN TO BE CLOSELY SUPERVISED BY AN ADULT.
4. PROHIBIT ANY "HORSEPLAY" OR THROWING OF SPARKLERS OR ANY OTHER FIREWORKS.
5. SELECT AN AREA FREE OF DRY GRASS OR OTHER READILY COMBUSTIBLE MATERIALS WHEN USING FIREWORKS.
6. PLACE ALL OF YOUR USED FIREWORKS INTO A SAFE RECEPTACLE.

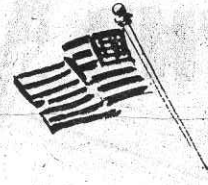

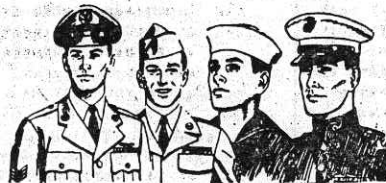

THE UPWARD LOOK

A CONGRESSMAN GOT A LETTER FROM A CONSTITUENT URGING HIM TO VOTE FOR A FARM BILL WHICH PROHIBITED CERTAIN MARKETING PRACTICES OF DOUBTFUL HONESTY.

"I'VE BEEN SELLING THIS WAY FOR YEARS," SAID THE LETTER AND

"I'M ASHAMED OF MYSELF. I CAN STOP." PEOPLE ARE WEAK AND SEEM TO NEED LAWS TO GUIDE THEM IN AVOIDING WRONG DOING.

MOST RELIGIONS TEACH PEOPLE TO OBTAIN MANY DETAILED "LAWS OF GOD." THEY EMPHASISE THAT CERTAIN ACTIONS ARE "SINS" AND SHOULD BE AVOIDED. IN A PRACTICAL AND IMMEDIATE WAY, THIS "WORKS."

I KNOW A MAN WHO CHANGED TO A CHURCH WHICH Hammers AGAINST SMOKING AND IT IS HELPING HIM GIVE IT UP. HIS OLD CHURCH WAS ALSO AGAINST IT, BUT CONSIDERED THE HABIT SO STUPID IT PERHAPS FAILED TO REALIZE HOW MUCH SPECIFIC HELP PEOPLE NEED IN GIVING UP STUPID HABITS.

BUT RULE BOOK RELIGION IS REALLY SECONDRATE. THE PHARISEES WERE RULE BOOK MEN AND JESUS SAID MANY HARSH THINGS AGAINST THEM. CENTRAL TO THE TEACHING OF BOTH JESUS AND PAUL IS THAT FIRST-RATE RELIGION IS NOT OF LAW, BUT OF THE SPIRIT.

RULE BOOK RELIGION OFTEN STRESSES UNIMPORTANT BUT RELATIVELY EASY-TO-CONQUER EVILS AND IGNORE THE HARDER BUT MORE IMPORTANT ONES. IT FOSTERS PRIDE AND NARROWNESS. 

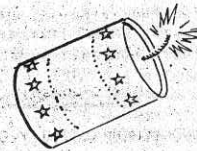

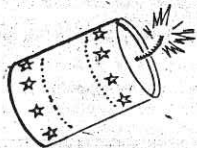
