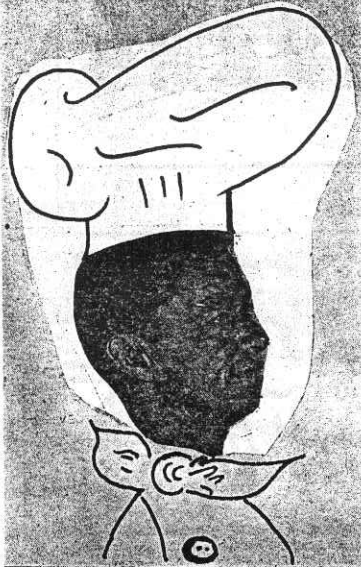

TIME, EFFORT, AND EXPENSE IS INVOLVED IN CONDITIONING A HOME FOR MARKET. TO LEARN THAT POTENTIAL BUYERS TURN THEIR BACKS ON YOUR HOME BECAUSE OF THE UNSIGHTLY APPEARANCE OF YOUR NEIGHBOR'S MUST BE AN EXTREMELY FRUSTRATING EXPERIENCE.

SURELY IF A RESIDENT WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE UP-KEEP OF HIS YARD HAS ANY AMBITION OR PRIDE HE WILL WATER AND CUT HIS GRASS, KEEP TRASH PICKED UP AND PUT HIS GARBAGE CAN AWAY -- OUT OF SIGHT FROM ALL -- WITHIN 24 HOURS AFTER PICKUP.

THE LAST LVRA MEETING

THE SEPTEMBER MEETING WAS HELD ON AUGUST 31, AS IS THE POLICY OF THE L.V.R.A., WHEN THE 1ST MONDAY OF A MONTH IS A HOLIDAY.

TROOP 477, CECIL PLATT, SCOUT MASTER, PRESENTED THE FLAG AND LED IN THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE. WE THANK YOU.

THE WAYS & MEANS COMMITTEE REPORTED THAT A VILLAGE RESIDENT, MR. HOMER HENSLEY HAD RECENTLY COMPLETED AUCTIONEERING SCHOOL IN INDIANA, AND WOULD OFFICIATE AT THE SCHEDULED MEN'S BAKE-OFF.

MAYOR DONALD LOGAN WAS THE FEATURED SPEAKER. MAYOR LOGAN REPORTED THAT THE CITY OF SUNNYVALE AND SANTA CLARA COUNTY HAD FINALLY REACHED AGREEMENT ON THE BUILDING OF THE PROPOSED PEDESTRIAN OVER-PASS AT THE SANDIA AND LAKEHAVEN CROSSING AT A COST OF ABOUT \$200,000. PLACEMENT OF THE OVER-PASS HAS YET TO BE DECIDED. IT IS ANTICIPATED THAT WITHIN 2 YEARS THE BAYSHORE OVER-PASS WILL BE WIDENED AND A PEDESTRIAN OVER-PASS SHOULD BE INCLUDED.

THE PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION ISSUE TO BE ON THE NOVEMBER 3RD BALLOT WILL POSSIBLY GIVE LAKEWOOD VILLAGE SOME TYPE OF TRANSPORTATION, PROBABLY NOT ON A GRAND SCALE TO BEGIN WITH, BUT AT LEAST MORE THAN WE NOW ENJOY.

THE PROPOSED HUGE SHOPPING CENTER TO BE CONSTRUCTED ON PART OF THE 460 ACRE SOUTHERN PACIFIC PROPERTY, BORDERED ON THE NORTH BY BAYSHORE AND ON THE WEST BY LAWRENCE EXPY, IS STILL IN THE PLANNING STAGE. IF MONEY DOESN'T GET TOO TIGHT IT SHOULD ACTUALLY COME TO PASS.

THE COMMUNITY SCHOOL CONCEPT WILL ALLOW YEAR-ROUND USE OF THE SCHOOLS. IT WILL PROBABLY BE TRIED AT S'VALE HIGH AND WILL BE JOINTLY SPONSORED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE CITY.

IN APPROXIMATELY 8 YEARS A REGIONAL BAYLANDS PARK WILL BE SITUATED WHERE OUR CITY DUMP NOW IS LOCATED.

THE PURCHASE OF SOUND EQUIPMENT WAS VOTED ON BY THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP FOLLOWING THE COFFEE BREAK. THE MOTION WAS PASSED TO MAKE THE PURCHASE AT A COST OF \$363.09.

IT WAS AGREED THAT IN THE FUTURE ALL BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETINGS WILL BE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AND HELD AT ONE OF THE SCHOOLS, PRIORITY BEING LAKEWOOD. TIME, DATE AND LOCATION WILL BE ANNOUNCED IN THE OCTOBER VILLAGER.

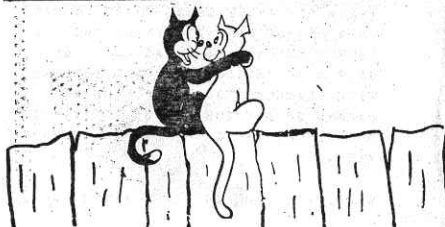

MEET YOUR NEIGHBOR

BACK AGAIN THIS MONTH WITH WHAT WE CONSIDER AN OUTSTANDING STORY, SOMEWHAT BELATELY, OF ONE OF OUR NEIGHBORS.

MR. & MRS. WILLIAM KRAUSE RESIDE AT 730 LAKEMUIR DR., WITH THEIR 4 CHILDREN AND A 15 YEAR OLD BOY RESCUED FROM "MISSISSIPPI SLAVERY." THE KRAUSES HAVE LIVED IN LAKEWOOD VILLAGE FOR SOMETIME AND RECENTLY PURCHASED THEIR HOME ON LAKEMUIR DR., LOOKS LIKE THEY PLAN TO STAY AS THEY HAVE STARTED THE PROCESS OF ADDING A FAMILY ROOM. THEY ARE LIKE MANY OTHER FAMILIES HERE, BILL HAS A FULL TIME JOB AS A MANUFACTURER'S REPRESENTATIVE AND MARY CERTAINLY HAS HER HANDS FULL WITH THEIR OWN 4 BOYS, AGES 1 1/2 TO 10. BILL FOUND TIME TO MANAGE A TEAM FOR LAKEWOOD YOUTH BASEBALL THIS SUMMER, WHILE MARTI WAS THEIR SECRETARY AND SERVED ON THE BOARD IN THAT CAPACITY FOR PART OF THE SEASON.

THE ONE BIG DIFFERENCE IN THE KRAUSES IS THAT THEY HAVE OPENED THEIR HOME AND HEARTS TO A BOY FROM MISSISSIPPI. PERHAPS SOME MAY THINK IT IN BAD TASTE TO MENTION THAT THE KRAUSE FAMILY IS CAUCASIAN AND VAN IS NEGRO, BUT I THINK IT IS NOTEWORTHY. THEY MET VAN THROUGH THE MISSISSIPPI BOX PROJECT. THE DESTITUTE STATE OF HIS LIFE BEFORE BILL AND MARTI BECAME HIS BENEFACTORS WAS VIVIDLY DESCRIBED IN AN ARTICLE IN THE SAN JOSE MERCURY ON JULY 16, 1970. THE ENTIRE FAMILY IS TO BE COMMENDED, UPON VISITING THEIR HOME ONE WOULD NEVER REALIZE THAT THE ABOVE STATED DISTINCTION EXISTED.

THAT IS THE TELEPHONE NUMBER OF THE NEW CRISIS AND INFORMATION SERVICE OFFERED BY THE EL CAMINO MENTAL HEALTH CENTER OF THE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT IN SUNNYVALE.

THIS SERVICE WILL BE IN OPERATION STARTING SEPTEMBER 8TH FROM 5 P.M., TO MIDNIGHT WEEK DAYS AND ON WEEKENDS TO SUPPLEMENT AND EXTEND THE REGULAR DAYTIME EMERGENCY PSYCHIATRIC SERVICE OF THE MENTAL HEALTH CENTER. IT HAS BEEN PLANNED TO MEET THE NEEDS OF RESIDENTS IN SUNNYVALE AND IN PARTS OF CUPERTINO AND MOUNTAIN VIEW.

A TEAM OF SPECIALLY TRAINED VOLUNTEERS WHO WILL MAN THE PHONES HAVE BEEN RECRUITED WITH THE HELP OF THE VOLUNTEER BUREAU OF SANTA CLARA COUNTY. COORDINATOR OF THE VOLUNTEERS IS MISS CAROL HUGHES, A PSYCHIATRIC SOCIAL WORKER OF THE CENTER.

THE VOLUNTEERS HAVE BEEN THROUGH A TEN WEEK TRAINING PROGRAM UNDER THE DIRECTION OF DR. BARRY HAYES AND CAROL HUGHES, AT ALL TIMES, AND ESPECIALLY IN EMERGENCY SITUATIONS, THE VOLUNTEER WILL HAVE PROFESSIONAL BACK-UP SUPPORT TO CALL UPON.

THE COURSE, TAUGHT BY VARIOUS MENTAL HEALTH CENTER PERSONNEL, INCLUDED SUBJECTS SUCH AS SUICIDE, ALCOHOLISM AND DRUG ABUSE, PARENT AND TEENAGER RELATIONS, REFERRAL TECHNIQUES AND COMMUNITY RESOURCES, AND PRACTICAL SESSIONS ON INTERVIEWING TECHNIQUES HELPFUL TO SOMEONE EMOTIONALLY UPSET.

THE UNIQUE NATURE OF THIS SERVICE FOR THE SUNNYVALE AREA MADE POSSIBLE BY VOLUNTEER HELP PERMITS THE POLICY THAT NO CHARGE WILL BE MADE TO CALLERS. ALTHOUGH THE PROGRAM IS ON A TRIAL BASIS TO DETERMINE THE EXACT NEED IN THE COMMUNITY, THERE APPEARS TO BE A GREAT VALUE AS IS SHOWN IN OTHER PROGRAMS OPERATING THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES.
