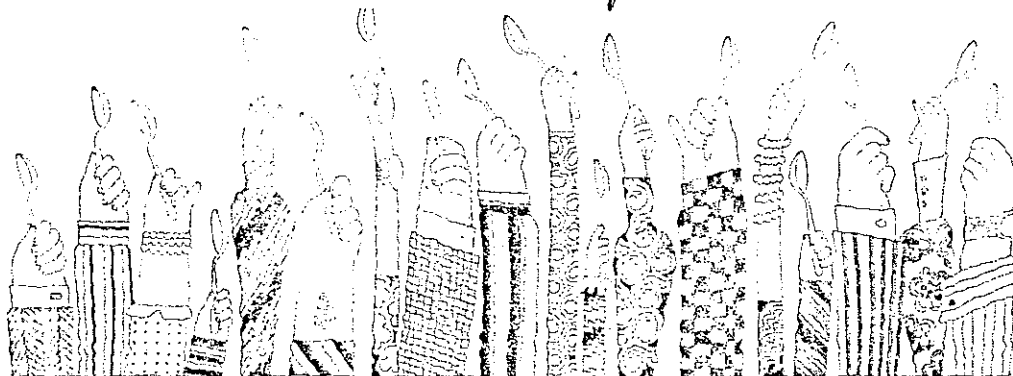

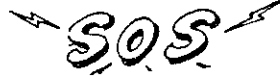

AFTER MONTHS OF WORK AND PLANNING WE ARE ONCE AGAIN UNITED IN AMERICA'S MOST POPULAR SPORT. THIS FAR INTO THE SEASON, WE HOPE THAT YOU HAVE FOUND TIME TO COME TO WATCH AT LEAST A FEW GAMES. HOW MUCH BETTER THE BOYS SEEM TO PLAY KNOWING THAT SOMEONE SHARES THEIR ENTHUSIASM.

ROBERT GUILFORD, WITH FULL COOPERATION AND ASSISTANCE OF MR. PETE ELLIS, OF THE COMMUNITY SCHOOL PROGRAM. WE WOULD LIKE TO MENTION THAT THE RESPONSE FROM THE FATHERS IN THIS PHASE OF THE LEAGUE, HAS BEEN OVER-WHELMING. WE ARE HOPING THAT THIS PROGRAM WILL PROMOTE A MUCH STRONGER AND MORE ORGANIZED MINOR GROUP IN THE FUTURE. IT IS ALSO A BIG STEP FOR THE SAFETY ASPECT. BY THE TIME THESE YOUNG BOYS GO INTO THE MINOR DIVISION THEY SHOULD BE ABLE TO PLAY THE GAME AND DEFEND THEMSELVES AGAINST THE ROUTINE MINOR ACCIDENTS THAT OFTEN COME FROM INEXPERIENCE. OUR HATS ARE OFF TO MR. GUILFORD, MR. ELLIS, MR. EMERSON, THE FATHERS AND TO OTHER MEN ON AND OFF THE BOARD, WHO HAVE DONE SUCH A FINE JOB IN SETTING UP THIS MUCH NEEDED PROGRAM. IT MAY INTEREST YOU TO KNOW THAT WE HAVE OVER 40 BOYS PARTICIPATING.

WE WOULD ALSO LIKE TO BRING OUT A FEW RULES AND SUGGESTIONS ON CONDUCT IN THE SNACK-BAR AND PLAYING AREAS.

1. NO BIKE RIDING WILL BE PERMITTED IN EITHER THE PLAYING AREAS OR THE SNACK-BAR AREAS. PLAYERS AND SPECTATORS WILL PLEASE PARK BIKES OUT OF PLAYING AND VIEWING AREAS. MANY PARENTS BRING SMALL CHILDREN TO THE GAMES AND IT COULD BE VERY UNFORTUNATE FOR A LITTLE TOT TO BE RUN DOWN.
2. PLEASE DO NOT LET CHILDREN CLIMB ON THE GRAND STANDS. IN THE PAST SEVERAL CHILDREN HAVE FALLEN AND HAD REQUIRED SUTURES.
3. PARENTS WHO BRING SMALL CHILDREN ARE ASKED TO WATCH THEM AT ALL TIMES. WE ALL TEND TO BECOME VERY EXCITED DURING THE GAMES BUT OFTEN LITTLE ONES BECOME BORED AND WONDER ONTO THE PLAYING FIELD. A LINE-DRIVE COULD PROVE DISASTEROUS. PLEASE, WATCH THEM CLOSELY!!!
4. PARENTS OR CHILDREN ARE NOT ALLOWED TO WATCH GAMES FROM THE DUG-OUTS. ONLY MANAGERS, COACHES AND PLAYERS ARE TO BE IN THESE AREAS.

"GOD CREATED MAN IN HIS OWN IMAGE. ALL MEN ARE CHILDREN OF GOD. GOD IS THEIR FATHER. ALL HUMAN BEINGS ARE MEANT TO BE BROTHERS. WE MUST TRY TO LOVE OUR NEIGHBORS AS OURSELVES."

OF COURSE IT IS HARD TO LIVE UP TO THESE GREAT TRUTHS. BUT IF YOU TRULY BELIEVE THEM, YOU WON'T STRAY FROM THEM AS FAR AS LT. CALLEY OR MANY OTHERS HAVE DONE IN THIS WAR AND OTHER WARS.

MANY AMERICANS SUPPORTED CALLEY BUT OTHERS FELT A GREAT SHAME FOR THEIR COUNTRY, NOT BECAUSE OF THIS ONE MAN BUT BECAUSE OF THE CRUEL AND DESTRUCTIVE WAY THIS WAR IS BEING FUGHT AND THE EXCESSIVE SUFFERING OF A SMALL NATION VICTIMIZED BY THE DREADFUL POWER OF MODERN WEAPONS AND THE CONFUSED IDEAS OF THOSE USING THEM.

ALL OF US MUST ASK OURSELVES VERY SERIOUSLY, "WHOM DO WE BELIEVE?" DO WE BELIEVE GOD? THE PRACTICAL CONSEQUENCES ARE CRITICAL AT THIS CONFUSED TIME IN HISTORY.

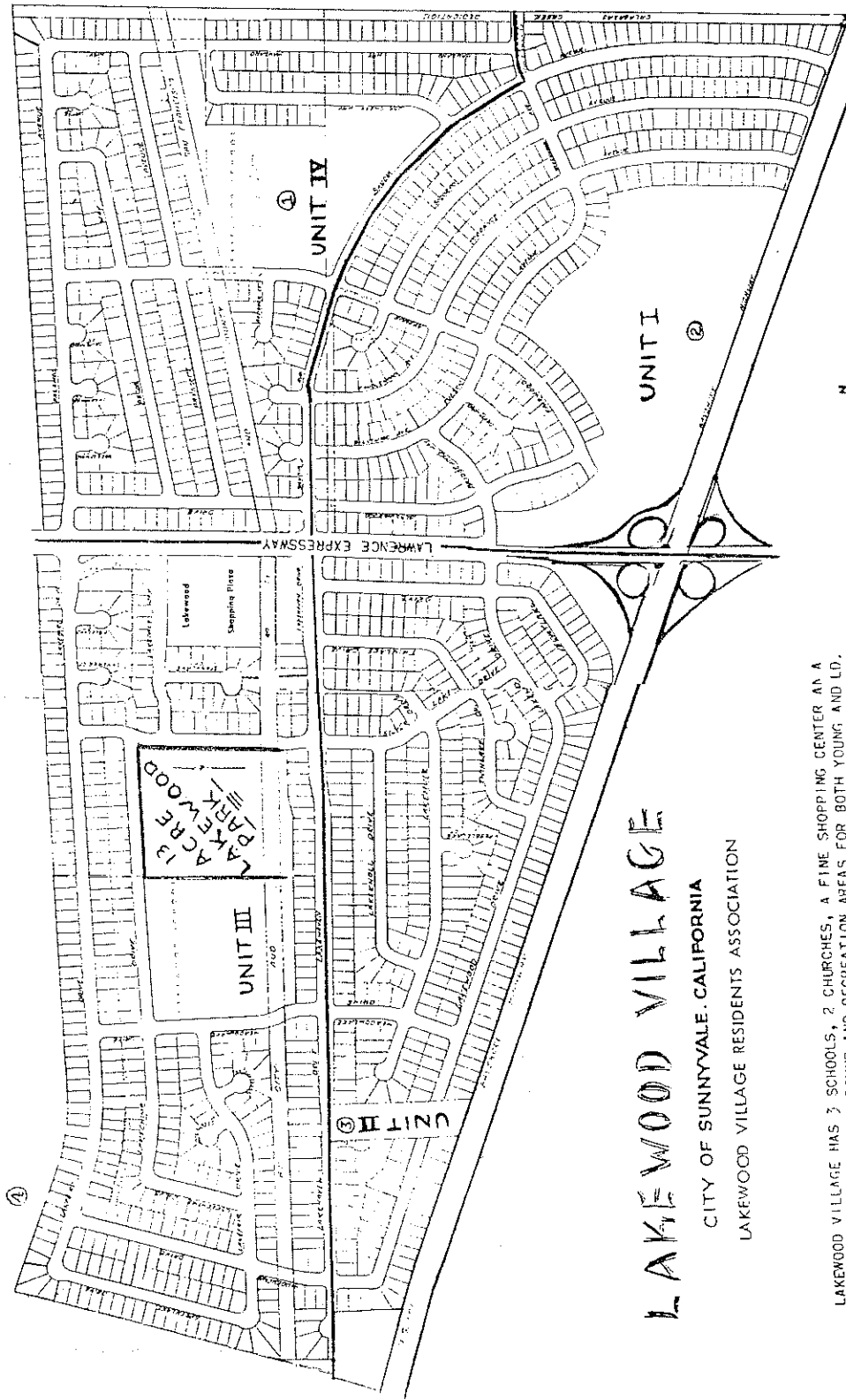

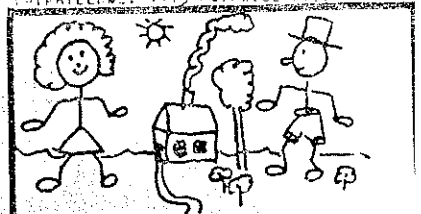
