### DATELINE LAKEWOOD:

#### PARTNER'S PROGRAM GROWING

Stunning reports are coming in from the field indicating a high level of support for the Partners Program. Since the extremely successful clean-up/B-BQ event held on April 25th to kick off Partners, members of the City of Sunnyvale team have distributed information packets to all of the homes in Lakewood. These packets contain helpful information on various city programs and ordinances designed to assist in the improvement of the neighborhood.

Prior to the kick off event, a survey was made of all the homes in the Lakewood Neighborhood to get some idea of what conditions existed in the community. In the few weeks

since the packets were distributed almost 30% of you folks have responded in a positive way by reviewing the information and taking action by cutting weeds, storing trash cans or removing debris from your front yards. This is a great beginning and we hope that more of you will "Jump On The Band-Wagon".

The City Field Staff are now in the process of visiting individual residents and attempting to resolve the remaining property maintenance problems. Partners is designed to Focus on property improvement issues that are visible from the street and have an impact on the appearance of the neighborhood. The specialists will be requesting, where appropriate, that property owners paint their homes, repair fences, remove weeds and debris, also store their trash containers properly. Public Safety has been and will continue to enforce the parking regulations for inoperable vehicles or vehicles parked on the lawns. You may want to check the orange sheet on Parking Regulations in your information packet and make sure you do not have a problem with the vehicles at your house.

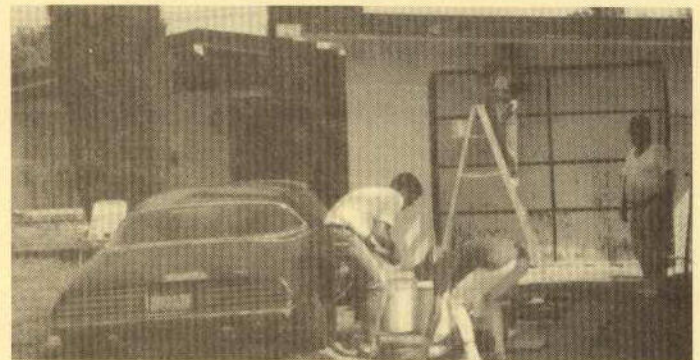
### News From Our Associate Reporters
